Issue

Once again, as in many previous seasons, the Bentley Cricket Club found the extra pressure of playing in 1st Grade a little beyond them. This statement is by no means meant as a criticism of the players who have represented the Club in this grade, but rather a cold hard fact that the Club has to accept. As long as Bentley has to train on syn—thetic surfaces and play on turf, we will find it difficult to com—pete with sides possessing better facilities and, at the same time, have problems in attracting top class, experienced players to bolster our on-field strength in the number 1 side.

This season, rookie coach 'ACE' HAYWARD found these factors combined with a dearth of fast bowlers, a real obstacle in his quest to establish Bentley as a force in 1st Grade. However, fielding a relatively inexperienced line-up, 'ACE' was able to engender a fine team spirit. Hopefully he will continue in his capacity next season when

the Club is bound to perform far better in 2nd Grade.

Each season our Club has a large turnover of players, losing a number of experienced players and attracting new players. The season just completed has been no exception. Missing from the 1979/80 line up were Lance Thompson, Stu Rankin, Phil Kenrick, Ken Ritchie, Ken Harmer, Clive Reynolds, Vic Eikelboom, Mark Seaman, Neville McGregor, Allan Saunders, Mike Reay, Garry Underwood plus another 8 players who played a combined total of 25 games for the Club. Most Clubs would find the loss of 20 players from their on-field staff a crippling blow. However, Bentley found able replacements in NOEL MYERS, DARRYL HIT--CHEN, BILL SKUTHORP, BRETT HAINES, JOHN McGURK, PETER FREDERICKS, DAVE FOX and IAN MARKHAM. A further 5 newcomers played a total of 9 games whilst RON STREET, JOHN HUGHES, PETER FARRALL, LEN MOULTON, GREG DART and MARTIN SMITH all made 'come-backs'.

Next season we must endeavour to avoid losing such a large number of players and, at the same time, continue to attract new players to the Club.

BENTLEY 'C' GRADE BUNDLED OUT IN SEMI-FINAL

An inept batting display on a dead wicket gave Bentley little chance of victory in their Semi Final against Churchlands.

Sent in to bat, Bentley received a setback in their first over when TONY MALINS was run out. STEVE CAIRNS and ALF SCHNEIDER defended grimly for a lengthy period but within an hour both were back in the pavilion together with JOHN McGURK and Bentley were 4-15. The in form batsman of the side, KEITH CHAPMAN, then combined with DAMIAN KNOWLES in the highest partnership of the innings - a rather ordinary stand of 24. MARTIN TYAS (12), LEN MOULTON (8) and GREG DART (9*) each aid-ed KEITH in restoring a modicum of respectability to the scoreboard but with the demise of KEITH for 37 with the score on 8-84 Bentley was left hoping for a traditional wag of the tail. Unfortunately, MIKE and GEOFF FARRALL, heroes in previous stands, were unable to fulfil these hopes and Bentley's innings closed for 88 in the same way it began - with a run out.

Churchlands were forced to struggle in the early part of their innings with GEOFF causing particular concern during the final sess—ion of the first day. However, after both openers had fallen to TONY with just 28 runs on the board, the Churchlands' batsmen, led by night watchman Duca, batted with fine self discipline to pass Bentley's sc—ore. A swashbuckling innings by 1st Grade player Raszkawajski yield—ed 87 runs but to the credit of the Bentley bowlers and fieldsmen, they stuck to their task admirably and made Churchlands fight for every run. After 89 overs the score had reached 9-212 when the proced—ings were halted upon MIKE capturing his 100th wicket for the club. The most successful bowlers were MIKE (2-18 from 13 overs) ALF (2-19 from 13 overs - his first 8 yielding just 1 run) and TONY (2-20 from 20 overs of which 10 were maidens).

ACHIEVEMENTS .

GAMES: During the season, BRIAN HAYWARD played his 100th game and HERB WIEGELE his 50th. Next season we should see TONY MALINS and GEORGE WOODHEAD each play their 150th games for the club, BILL HARMER should play his 100th game whilst PETER QUARTERMAINE, PHIL ROBERTS, DAVE EWING, PETER ROACH, RAY HARMER and GREG NAIRN could all play their 50th games for the Club.

RUNS: During the season TONY MALINS scored his 1000th run for Ben--tley. Next season PETER QUARTERMAINE, MIKE FARRALL, DAVE EWING, JOHN WILLIAMS and STEVE CAIRNS could all equal this achievement whilst BRIAN HAYWARD could top the 2000run mark. Both GEOFF FARRALL and LLOYD DUNGEY are rapidly nearing the 4000run mark - a tally yet to be achieved by any Bentley player, past or present.

WICKETS: GEOFF FARRALL'S 1000th wicket was one of the highlights of the season whilst GEORGE WOODHEAD reached the 300 mark and both GREG NAIRN and MIKE FARRALL took their 100th wickets (MIKE joining his brothers PETER and STEVE to become a hat trick of centurion sons for GEOFF). Next season BILL HARMER, ANDREW HAYWARD and ALF SCHNEIDER are possibilities to take their 100th wickets.

HIGHEST SCORES: Players to have represented Bentley prior to this season who scored their highest score for the club this season are: BRIAN HAYWARD (107), PETER OUARTERMAINE (75*), DAVE EWING (69), ALF SCHNEIDER (66), HAYDN GRAY (64), TONY MALINS (56), MIKE FARRALL (52*), KEN BOYES (48), JOHN HUGHES (46), DAMIAN KNOWLES (35), PHIL (52*), and STEVE MILLS (31). BRETT HAINES (63* & 53) was the only "rookie" to notch a half-century.
