E D I T O R I A L

This "edition of the "Bentley Cricketer" is unique in several ways. Two or three years ago, the "Bentley Cricketer" originated as a spasmodically produced newsletter which contained the occasional match report, notices of future functions and the odd opinion or two, all on one page. This year, it graduated to a fortnightly production and also it grew in size with detailed reports of every match. This edition is definitely the most ambitious attempt to date and it is not a coincidence that it appears in the same year that Bentley gained its first Premiership in over a decade. It is coincidental, however, that this Premiership occurred exactly 20 years after the Club's inception.

Inside, is a match report of the Grand Final, comprehensive records of the Club and pen-pictures of the players behind our Premiership.

A PREMIERSHIP AFTER YEARS IN THE WILDERNESS.

The 1973/74 3rd Grade Grand Final between Bentley and Claremont played at College Park commenced with WAYNE PULVER winning the toss for Bentley and electing to bat. PHIL KENRICK and KEN RITCHIE immediately set about justifying this decision. This pair kept the runs flowing in even time until, at 57, the first wicket fell when PHIL was run out for a soundly compiled 20. Two runs later KEN edged a ball into the slips and he was dismissed for 36. His innings included 5 fours and, with PHIL, he had laid the foundation for a good Bentley score. GREG DART and KEITH CHARMAN then took the score to 73 before GREG lifted his head and was bowled for 13. KEITH then was joined by STU RANKIN and the score progressed steadily with KEITH content to defend whilst STU attacked the bowling. Unfortunately, KEITH was run out before his innings could blossom and Bentley were 4-92. Just as the Bentley score began to build, STU suffered a similar fate to PHIL & KEN. His innings of 32 had added substance to the middle order and it was he who knocked the Claremont fast bowler out of the attack with some powerful hitting. The score at this stage was 5-121 and a final tally of 200 had become a distinct possibility. HERB WEIGIE carried on where his partner had left off but he received only token assistance from the remaining batsmen and when he was dismissed for an excellent 36, Bentley were all out for 177.

In the three overs before stumps on the first day, STU struck two telling blows from which Claremont never really recovered. In the space of just 13 balls he removed both openers to have the score 2 for 1 at stumps. The following day saw STU once again in great form when he bowled another opposition batsman with his second ball of the day. Three overs later, HERB got in on the act to have Claremont 4 for 7. Claremont then staged a brief recovery to reach 29 without further loss. However, STU once again struck after WAYNE had switched him to the other end. Further blows followed almost immediately as STU and HERB claimed wickets to make it 7 for 36. A sound partnership of 42 then denied Bentley the opportunity of enforcing the follow-on but STEVE FARRALL and GEOFF FARRALL ensured that Bentley had a substantial first innings lead when they finished off the last 3 batsmen to have Claremont all out for 96. STU had bowled magnificently to take 5 for 16 from 11 overs. HERB was a good foil for STU and he took 2 for 27 from 10 overs. STEVE's 2-31 from 7 overs was a sound contribution and GEOFF took 1 for 14 from 6.1 overs.

Bentley's jubilation soon changed to great alarm when, an hour later, the scoreboard read 6-31. The only apparent ray of hope was the figure of STU who was 12* at this stage. At this vital stage he was joined by WAYNE and this pair figured in a match saving partnership of 42 which was better measured in minutes devoured. WAYNE was eventually out for 10, a figure which belies the true value of his innings. Without further addition STU was out for 43, a truly great knock under intense pressure. Once again Bentley was not out of the woods, but a sound partnership of 20 between

BRIAN HAYWARD and GEOFF made Claremont's chances look remote. Bentley were finally all out for 95, which left Claremont 67 minutes plus 15 overs in which to make 177.

Claremont had no option but to chase the runs. The first over saw STU claim a wicket with WAYNE taking a good catch behind. However, the runs began to accumulate in good time and Claremont reached 4-69 when the final 15 overs commenced. STU had taken two wickets and HERB one since the fall of the first and it had only been in the last few overs that these two had began to restrict the scoring. The stage was set for a thrilling finish with Claremont needing 7 runs an over. However, their hopes were immediately dashed when, in the next 5 overs, four wickets fell to see them 8 for 85. STU had claimed his fourth victim whilst HERB had captured 3 wickets in 15 balls. The remaining Claremont batsmen never looked dangerous but they proved quite troublesome to move but in the 13th of the last 15, HERB struck to make them 9-120 and in the last over of the day, HERB finished off the Claremont innings with the score at 129. Bentley had won by 47 runs and a crowd of jubilant supporters rushed onto the oval to congratulate the tired but elated Bentley side. HERB finished with 6 for 59 and STU 4 for 61. Both had bowled 15 overs unchanged - a truly stout-hearted effort.

THE MEN BEHIND THE PREMIERSHIP

KEITH CHAPMAN (8 games; 182 runs @ 22.7) "Chappy" came into the side in the latter half of the season. He was in magnificent form against Subiaco (67*) and City Beach (64) and he gave stability to the innings after the openers had departed.

GREG DART (16 games; 311 @ 18.3) Apart from a slump early in the season, "G.D." was a model of consistency. His 77* against Nollamarra was an outstanding effort and his personal best. He performed particularly well in the Semi Final with 24 & 20 and he vice-captained the side in the Grand Final.

LLOYD DUNGEY (15 games; 154 @ 12.8) Lloyd had a bad slump mid-season but had only limited opportunities thereafter. Thus, his 17* in the Semi Final was a fine effort. His best scores were 40* vs City Beach and 31* vs Subiaco. He proved to be an ever-reliable fieldsman and won the Club fielding trophy.

GEOFF FARRALL (15 games, 132 @ 11.0 and 64 wickets @ 9.2) "Foxy" was a consistent and economical wicket taker throughout the season. His best efforts were 8-26 vs Nollamarra, 5-21 vs Teachers and 5-51 vs Wembley. His 5-29 and 2-13 in the Semi was a great performance. He was a good performer with the bat and his 33 vs Wembley was a fine example.

STEVE FARRALL (3 games, 5w @ 21.8) Steve replaced the injured "C.A." in the Grand Final and acquitted himself well in taking 2-31. He opened the attack early in the season and is definitely a player of the future.

BRIAN HAYWARD (12 games 77 @ 9.6) Brian excelled as a fieldsman throughout the season. However, he had only limited opportunities to prove himself as a batsman. His best effort was 22 vs Claremont in the first round.

PHIL KENRICK (12 games, 158 @ 11.3) Phil's efforts could not be measured in runs alone. As an opener, he consistently weathered the new ball attack and featured in several good opening stands including one of 57 in the Grand Final. In that game, his 20 was his best innings though he made a good 25* vs Nollamarra.

KEN LITTLE (7 games, 96 @ 10.7 and 13w @ 8.9) "Harold" played during the middle part of the season and was 12th man in the Grand Final. His 26 and 3-16 vs Claremont was a fine all-round effort as was his 3-4, 15 and 21 vs South Perth.

TONY MALINS (14 games; 57 @ 7.1 and 45w @ 10.3) "C.A." was vice-captain of the side and he really 'burnt' early in the season with 5-19 & 5-18 vs South Perth and 4-12 & 4-15 vs Subiaco being his best efforts. He lost form later and, apart from 5-30 vs Subiaco, he took only 1 wicket in five matches. His batting showed improvement and his 20 vs Nollamarra was a fine innings.

WAYNE PULVER (captain, 16 games; 196 @ 11.5) Wayne proved to be a great leader on the field and a more than useful bat. He overcame a bad mid-season slump to rescue the side in the Semi-Final with a great 30. As an opener he made 39 vs Wembley and as a fieldsman he was an inspiration with his close in fielding. Later he kept wicket effectively. His efforts

In the Grand Final were indicative of a good captain. STU RANKIN (15 games, 424 @ 32.6, 62w @ 10.2) The highlight of Stu's season, and no doubt his career, was his match winning Grand Final 2-57 & 4-31 in the Semi Final. During the season, Stu's better scores were 58 vs Wembley, 56* vs Claremont, 38* vs Teachers, 37 vs Wembley and 33 vs Nollamarra. His bowling efforts included 5-8 vs Teachers, 5-12 vs Claremont and 5-43 vs Teachers. His all-round prowess made him the back-bone of the team.

KEN RITCHIE (16 games, 302 @ 15.9) Ken graduated to opener early in the season and reached great heights in the Grand Final with a fine 36. He also made 43 vs Subiaco, 29 vs Claremont and 26 vs South Perth. He kept wicket in grand style early in the season but lost form in this department when he began opening.

HERB WEIGLE (9 games, 241 @ 26.8, 31w @ 8.6) Herb showed tremendous 'Big Game' temperament and was little behind Stu Rankin in effectiveness in the finals. In the Semi he made a match winning 46* and took 4-24 and 3-12 whilst in the Grand Final he scored 36 and took 2-27 and 6-59. During the season he made 51 vs Subiaco & 25* vs Teachers and took 4-16 vs South Perth.

LEN WOODIEY (5 games, 5w @ 10.2) Apart from being in the XI on 5 occasions Len was 12th man on several occasions including the Semi Final. He was a good change bowler and he claimed 2-13 vs South Perth.

Others to represent the side during the year were JOHN BULLOCK, RON STREET, LES NEWTON, GEORGE WOODHEAD, ERIC BUNN and PETER FARRALL. These six played a total of 13 games amongst them.
