

EDITORIAL

One could hardly describe the recently completed 1978/79 season as being very successful. On the field, the three Bentley sides did little better than the previous season's performances although the top side did show greater determination and their position at the foot of the premiership was not an indication of their efforts.

Off the field, despite the efforts of the committee, the Club's fund raising activities failed to measure up to expectations. This was mainly due to a frustrating string of events which saw many club functions either postponed or cancelled. The drop off in bingo attendances due to late night shopping on Thursdays provided a further source of disappointment for the committee. All of this means that next season's committee will have to closely examine the financial

situation of the club, including that hardy annual - fees.

Despite the picture of gloom I have so far portrayed, there were several pleasing features which emerged during the season. Coach, BOB MASSIE, proved to be a fine aquisition to the club and he engendered a fighting spirit in his charges. However he faced a very hard task in moulding a side when one considers the players who did not re-appear after the '78/78 season. The loss of players of the calibre of Stu Rankin, Greg Nairn, Jim Leinasars, Laurie Price, Ron Street, Noel Hughes, Graham Corey (all players who have used the new ball in A Grade), Mike Farrall, Gary Lymn and John Ham combined with the loss of Ken Ritchie, Keith Chapman and Don Glover during the season provided gaps which few clubs could fill. On the credit side, apart from BOB, the club gained DARRYL SMITH, CLIVE REYNOLDS (both made the top side), ALF SCHNEIDER, MIKE REAY, MARTIN TYAS, HAYDN GRAY, MARK SEAMAN, DAVE SAVILLE, MARK ELFIC, GEOFF CHAMPION, MARTIN SMITH and ANDREW WHEATLEY whilst LANCE THOMPSON, VIC EIKELBOOM and KEN ESMOND rejoined the club. The fact that 4 of these players won trophies this season augurs well for the future.

Whilst several functions this season proved to be either non-events or poorly attended, the club, once again, conducted a number of very successful events. These included the car rally, the first quiz night, the double wicket competition and players' teas. If other functions had been as well attended as these, the club may have found itself in

a better financial position than it is at present.

Next season will not be without its problems. The club needs to retain as many current players as possible, to recruit two or three top players and to support the incoming committee fully in all fund raising activities.


