Chairman of Selectors Report

Season 2021/22 saw the club excel and grow in many ways and this was rewarded with our best season in 6 years with the club playing in three grand finals and hosting a 1st grade final for the first time ever. No new flags on the wall is a disappointment for sure but one gets the sense that we are not far away at all from breaking down the wall.

Leadership started right at the top of the playing group with the club captaincy revived by Manual Hunwick, who led his team and club with distinction until a career move saw him shift to Melbourne at the Christmas break. A replacement would not be easy to find as these were already big shoes to fill, the cricket department (Josh and Hol) over the summer recess interviewed prospective candidates and the choice was unanimous. The enthusiasm and passion Manny brought to the group was continued by Mitchell Crew, who took over the reins with aplomb and generated a spirit of togetherness within the team not seen for many a season. There can be no doubt that this is the leadership that saw Mitch single-handedly pull his team over the line in the greatest finals come-from-nowhere win in club history, the captain taking the last three wickets in the space of 7 balls to win by 3 runs.

The recruitment of Travis Keys from Bayswater Morley CC was the club's big off-season signing with Joshua Ericson taking on the challenging role as cricket manager and doing a fine job, getting contracts signed and reigning in captains (get those fielding votes in) with strong emphasis on maintaining standards and club tradition which was duly heeded for the most part, without Josh we wouldn't have got to where we did and nor would we have significant funds in the fines kitty for a bus trip.

Travis certainly wasted no time making his impression on WASTCA, peeling off a century in his club debut, 119 v Balcatta (117b, 9x fours, 4x sixes). Travis is the third ever BCC player to tonne up on debut, after Dave Berry and Paul Inkster. Together with great mate Manuel, Bentley's batting was stronger than ever with both players in the top 3 1st grade run scorers by Christmas as Manny followed suit with a century in round 3, finishing up with 333@66.60 by Christmas to take out the average award by some margin. Trav finished with 422@35.17 and evergreen Awais Mehdi stepped up to the plate after Christmas as well, taking the aggregate award with 441@33.92. Veteran Omo Fanayan recovered from a lean run to play a key role in the middle order making 235@19.58 and we added Nishanth Sampath as an aggressive opening option (225@22.5) in partnership with Jack Duffy who also produced 206@18.73, some great figures for openers. Dangerous Ish Khan also continued to improve as a batsman, his lower order runs (191@27.29) a huge contribution in a season of tight results, none more so than the semi-final against High Wycombe where a 100 run 7th wicket stand with Fab Fanayan playing the innings of his season set an impressive victory target. Such a long list of successful batsmen proves how evenly the boys contributed to the team with special mention to Cam Daw who set aside 2nd XI captaincy to fill Manny's spot after Christmas and fitted into the team immediately.

Bowling was led by Ish Khan, 24@15.58 and the incredibly consistent Chucky Palumbo reeled off 22 wickets, bringing up 100 1st XI wickets in just 5 seasons. Awais Medhi renewed his credentials as the most capable all-rounder in the competition with 21 wickets, taking out the WASTCA Chairman's medal as well. Mitch Crew perhaps thrown by the captaincy and purely OD matches from a shortened season recovered well to produce his best for the two finals, finishing with 18 wickets. Tasman Harris and Daniel Cheeseman both tending to share the last spot at selections due to work availability, Tas had to wait until after Christmas for his maiden wicket but went on to take 12 wickets in his last 5 matches.

The second side saw the return of BCC Life member, premierships captain Steven Paice, returning to the club after departing at the end of 2016/17. He brought with him son Tye O'Connell and journeyman Bobby Banerjee joined the team. Young gun Benny Whelpdale who started in the fours more or less bashed the door down with 151 runs in three consecutive innings to join his mate Tye in the twos, Ben acquitted himself so well he made his 1st XI debut a month later. With the likes of Rex McCormack and Fletcher Ghandour bowling wheels and bouncing around in the covers the twos looked practically youthful in the field. Steve's return was fortuitous as the team found itself needing a new captain to replace the elevated Daw and Paicey was an automatic pick.

The batting order proved to be somewhat fragile, with the side only once producing more than one 50+ partnership to an innings. One player did stand up and saw far more deliveries than anyone else in the team, evergreen Chris Pritchard 281@28.10 showing everyone the right temperament and pace to play two-day matches. Pritchty involved himself in 4 of 8 team half century stands and the only century stand. Ben Whelpdale exhibited this trait too and with 149@29.8 from just 5 innings his days of carpet cricket are well and truly finished.

MB Rauf had been keen to step up his game to turf level having played threes last season and bowled some match turning spells for the side as the first-choice spin option with 13 wickets. Mauneeek Solanki (12@11.67) was the most potent bowler in the side, but fatherhood saw him depart halfway through round five leaving Josh Ericson (15 wickets) without an opening partner. Despite some new ball hesitancy Jay Smith adjusted to the role and kept things consistent to end up taking 19@15.58. Andrew Stace and Ali Khan also gained more valuable turf experience as Lucky Singh and Austin Keyte made impressive cameos, hopefully to see more cricket at twos level in the seasons to come. The twos also enjoyed the services of Umpire Chris Lockyer for many matches this season and Wingnut was certainly regarded by both sides as one of the better umpires in third grade.

The threes were on a mission this season under UJ Bhan and finals was always front and center of the captain's mind. Team guru Tony Magill continued to build his cult status amongst the young Indian side, bowling spells of unnerving length and consistency and apparently out-sprinting teammates in the field much to the mirth of the slips cordon. Tony's one match elevation to the twos cost him the bowling average trophy for 3rd XI: including three finals he produced 19@13.79 with the ball and 248@22.55 with the bat which are outstanding numbers. Forming a double act with Tony in the all-rounder stakes was Jonty Saini, the aggressive middle order batter, producing 276@23.00 and his three-step quicks rendering 24 victims @14.42, certainly putting him in consideration for higher honours next season. Surprise packet for the season was Maaz Hassan, batting at most positions in the order finishing with 263 runs and winning the average award as well as taking the gloves in the team proving to be a most versatile cricketer. Steady at the top of the order was Lucky Singh, making 180 runs against the new ball and significantly increasing his bowling workload to 61 overs, snaring 11 wickets in the process. The dynamic duo of Jithu and Mahendra came into the club in November and worked their way up from the fours to make finals spots in the threes. Captain Bhan had a comparatively lean season with the ball, possibly committing the cardinal sin of a bowling captain and underbowling but all such misgivings were cast aside come the semi-final, ball in hand the captain blew South Perth out of the water with a spell of 9.1-3-11-5. Captain Bhan was also able to source a large quantity of top up players throughout the season when we were short of numbers to fill-in with the threes and without this capacity, we would not have been able to keep five sides on the park. Simply put this side on it's day was a head above the remainder of the grade but unfortunately coming up against the Subiaco Marist side, head and shoulders above the grade the Bentley side came off second best in both encounters.

Fours this season continued in 7th grade and the volatility of selections and varying strength of opposition proved to be a challenge for Keg McKeig and deputy Darren Leng. A side consisting of experienced heads and young developers struggled to compete in some fixtures, but nonetheless important lessons were learnt, and no doubt wisdom imparted to a new generation of Bentley Blues which is what it's all about. Batting was led by the trio of McKeig (224@28), Beauscasin (209@19) and Daquino (180@18) and the aforementioned Whelpdale also carved out 160@40 in 4 digs before the selectors pounced. Jason Marlborough returned to the side and Austin Ketye played some impressive innings with flashes of inconsistent brilliance seen elsewhere. The captain always ensured everyone got picked as a bat or a bowler, so resultingly Darren Leng cemented as the opening bowler didn't get many chances with the blade. He certainly made up for that with the ball in hand, the sultan of swing following up a 5fa with a 7fa to have an astonishing 17 wickets at the end of November. Unfortunately, the big hauls dried up from there with the bread and butter two day fixtures being removed and only limited overs available to bowl. Nevertheless, Lengy finished up with 21@21.81 from a whopping 105 overs, bowling 22% of the side's deliveries. Club legend Greg Nairn returned to play with his beloved Blues after an 11 year absence and between injuries and work commitments he continued bowling with his wily ways, even playing alongside son Josh in the last game of the year we certainly hope to retain them both next season. Clint McMurray was called upon to bowl in a more frontline role and increased his workload but unfortunately was not rewarded with wickets accordingly. Debutant Jake Hall, alongside Laurie Gray and Thomas Watson all got important overs under the belt which should increase next season. Cam McNab was gloved most of the time so primary spin duties fell to captain McKeig who produced 14@16.36 and will be hoping to play less of a spearhead role in seasons to come.

The One Day side certainly struggled this season, both due to the increasing standard (and youth!) of teams competing in OD2 competition and the difficulty in establishing a consistent 'core' of players for the side. Captain/Coach Justin Warren was at the helm and joined by VC of old Geoff Dart they were able to keep the spirits up as the chorus line of legends lined up for yet another season occupying Maniana, the spiritual home of Bentley old boys. PC and Les Saxon, Simon Cleary, Freighter Hewitt, Shearing, Dungey, Vlismas, Harmer, names that have appeared in many a yearbook report over the last two decades. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be as the side finished with the wooden spoon with two wins and a regrettable forfeit. Selections towards the end of the season became more of a ring around and the side was sent out with less than eleven men on occasions. Highlights were few and far between but the Holly tonning up in the last match, putting on a century opening stand with Freighter was memorable. Hol's heroics delivered the batting trophy with 270@33.75, Freighter as well finished with 199@22.11 and rounding out the top three was Kieran Smith's 151@30.20 from six appearances, including a match winning 44 to anchor the innings in the team's best win of the season to chase 200 against Western Suburbs. The stats page will tell the story as the batting pretty much stopped there depending on who was in or out any particular week.

Bowling wise PC and Les continued their opening partnership and bowled 35% of the side's deliveries between themselves from the 24 bowlers used. Poles were hard to come by as the team took an average 6 wickets per match. So much so McNab's 6/14 placed him equal 4th on wicket tally from 6.5 overs in the season. Matt Harmer also took 9@16.00 but could only manage 4 matches around work commitments. Enthusiasm came from newcomers Andrew Pope and Carlton Lee, Rob Ellis and Bryn Holton who we hope to see returning for more cricket in 2022/23. The team was beneficiary to a number of one game ring ins, specifically Reece Coleman, Gordon Naley, Jamie George, Ken DeJager, Jamey Riches and Michael Bowen. Thank you for putting your hand up for the club.

The shortened season was perhaps a blessing as after Christmas I felt the viability of the club holding on to five sides was coming into some question. Commitments outside of cricket seem to encroach our playing group more than ever before. We need greater participation in training, fielding training particularly for those who struggle with this aspect of the game. Catches win matches and we've seen plenty gone begging this season from gettable chances.

Off-field our small but hard-working committee have kept things ticking away beautifully and with Steve Shearing and Chris Pritchard on the hustings we are confident the turf training wicket project will shortly get the greenlight from the authorities. Jesse Liddle sacrificing his own playing commitment to continue building our juniors club is incredibly admirable. Anyone who is curious about the way the club works I encourage them to attend our AGM and/or volunteer at committee level. The club can continue to grow with a larger committee, with a women's team the next long-term goal as well as a fully integrated juniors program feeding into our seniors.

1st Side Report

The 2021/22 season started with a sense of excitement after a few changes in the 1st grade side from the season prior. Most notably the announcement that Manuel Hunwick would be taking on the role as club/1st team captain. Our team had a good mix of youth and experience. With a new leader there was optimism in what the team could produce despite some outsiders tipping a poor season. There was plenty of new faces in the squad with the inclusion of Tasman Harris, Nishanth Sampath and Travis Keys joining after playing for other sides in the WACA competition.

The season started out at Jones Paskin Reserve against Balcatta, where Manuel won the toss and batted first. After playing plenty of first and second grade for Bayswater-Morley in the WACA, we had high hopes for Travis Keys in his debut. He did not disappoint. Opening the batting he belted 119, showing his class and experience would be vital for the team's success throughout the season. Awais Mehdi was his reliable self with the ball, taking 4 wickets to help secure a round 1 win that gave a solid platform to launch our season.

Round 2 we were up against Swanbourne at home. Bowling first we restricted them to 156 off their 40 overs with Adam Palumbo the only bowler to take multiple wickets. The top order went about their work superbly to chase the score in just 24 overs to give us our second win.

Round 3 was another game for milestones, whilst all the bowlers had an even contribution, it was captain Manuel who led the team to victory over High Wycombe with 114 not out, chasing 201 down quite comfortably to give us our third consecutive win.

Round 4 took us to Swan Valley. Winning the toss and batting first, it was once again the batsmen who put us in a strong position. With Jack Duffy (72), Nish Sampath (66), Manuel (44), Awais (37) and Omo Fanayan (42) all scoring runs, we posted 309 and never looked in trouble. With a big total to defend, we were able to restrict Swan Valley, with myself and Awais both taking 3 while Adam Palumbo took 2, eventually bowling out Swan Valley for 143 in a big win. 4 from 4 was a great start to the season, and the confidence within the group was growing.

Our first defeat of the season was in round 5 at home against Murdoch-Melville. Batting first, we never got going. Omo (39) was the only batsmen to score over 20 and we were ultimately bowled out for 159. The bowlers did a fantastic job to keep us in the game, and at one point had them 6/66 but unfortunately, we couldn't capitalise on the strong start. Ish was the pick of the bowlers with four wickets while Omo enjoyed a rare bowl at the end of the day, picking up 3 quick wickets and questioning why he hadn't bowled earlier in the season.

Round 6 was again at home against Wembley who are always a tough opponent, with some very experienced players. Batting first they were able to score 198, though at one stage they were looking at a much higher total at 4/176. Adam Palumbo and Awais Mehdi both took 4 wickets to be the pick of the bowlers. Awais then followed up with the bat scoring 74, taking us to a 4 wicket win with the support of Manuel (49) and Travis (38). Overall a great win against a good team.

Our last game before Christmas saw us away against Bedford Morley. Batting first we were going along nicely at 4/123 but couldn't continue, being bowled out for 147 in a poor finish to our innings. It wasn't a massive total, but it gave us something to defend. We got off to a great start with the ball, having them 4/20 and I was lucky enough to get my first hat-trick. Something I'll cherish forever. A couple more wickets and suddenly they were 6/47 and we were in a good position. Unfortunately, just like the batting, we couldn't finish off the solid start we'd created. Bedford Morley chasing our total 8 down in what was a pretty disappointing game all round.

Going into the Christmas break we were in a good position with 5 wins, but there was some unfortunate news. Manuel would be leaving us and moving to Melbourne for work, which was going to be a big loss in our batting department after averaging 66.6. A change of captain at the halfway point wasn't ideal but I am very thankful that the players and club gave me the opportunity to lead the club for the remainder of the season.

Our first game after Christmas was a big challenge, coming up against the top team, High Wycombe. While welcoming the new year, we also welcomed 2nd grade captain Cam Daw to the team and young gun Ben Whepdale made his 1st grade debut after solid performances in the lower grades. Batting first we made 183 off our 40 with an even contribution and building a good score to defend. We never really got going with the ball and high Wycombe chased down our score with 5 overs to spare. Adam Palumbo was once again the pick of the bowlers with 3.

Round 9 saw us facing Swan Valley again. We batted first and at 6/89 we were in a precarious position before Ish Khan had a mini cameo scoring 37 and boosting us to 167 from our 40. Some early wickets from Ish and Taz Harris had us back in the game but Swan Valley built some partnerships to get to 7/154 before Ish once again proved his worth, getting the next 2 before a run out sealed the win, bowling the opposition out for 164 in a nail-biting finish.

With the WA border due to re-open in early February, the WASTCA made the decision to shorten the season from 12 games to 11 and all remaining games were to be played as one day games besides finals. This meant we only had 2 games left to secure our spot in the top 4 and finals. 2 wins would cement our spot whilst 1 still left room for another team to leapfrog us.

That in mind, round 10 we were up against South Perth who were sitting bottom of the ladder. Although it was an important game to win, I think a few of us thought it would be a walk over and that wasn't the case. We batted first and never got going. Awais (90) and Nish (89) put on a display of power hitting, taking us to a very strong 252 off our 40 overs. Taz Harris was dominant with 4 wickets, eventually bowling them out for 170 and securing the win. With that we finished 3rd and qualified for finals which was fantastic.

The semi-final would have to be one of the most memorable games I have been a part of. We were up against High Wycombe, who had just beaten us and were in good form. I won the toss and decided to have a bat. We got off to a reasonable start with Trav getting to 50 but at 5/127 we still had some work to do to post a competitive total. In come Fab and Ish. Fab was under some duress, recovering from gastro he was superb to bat as long as he did, scoring 60 at a crucial point of the game. Ish was a fine partner, scoring 53 in an entertaining innings. A great partnership that gave us a competitive total of 272.

We returned on Sunday with confidence but knew it would be an arm wrestle. They were 4/96 shortly after lunch and the game was in the balance. HW started to build a couple of partnerships and despite our best efforts they were suddenly 6/229, the game and the final was slipping away from us. Chucky and Awais worked hard all day but HW were still able to score runs with ease. At 6/269 the game was against us, but what happened in the next 10 minutes will be remembered for a long time to come. Trav took a nice stumping off of Awais's bowling and they were 7/270. First ball of my over I got a wicket, and the belief grew a little. We took the risk and put a slip in for the new batter, and it paid off! 4th ball I got the edge and Duff took a great catch. 9/270 and suddenly it was game on. Awais was to bowl again, first ball the batsmen hit it straight to me at cover and called yes, taking off immediately. The ball bounced nicely into my hands and I threw it in to Trav. As if it was in slow motion it clipped the top of the stumps and the umpires finger went up. Disbelief. We were off celebrating, pulling off an absolute miracle to bowl out HW for 270. The grand final awaited us after an incredible win!

Grand final week got off to a great start, finding out that the game would be played at Wyong was a massive occasion for the club. We were playing Wembley after they had a strong win over Murdoch-Melville in their semi. Unfortunately, I lost the toss and they wanted to bat first. They had a very strong batting line up and we knew we'd have to grind away. We started well but they were up for the fight, building partnerships they were able to score 246 from their 80 overs. Ish, Taz, Chucky and Awais all took 2 wickets and bowled exceptionally well throughout the whole day.

We arrived on Sunday with a big task in front of us but also looking forward to it. We lost an early wicket before Trav and Duff put on a mini partnership to get us to 1/47. From there it was a common theme of regular wickets. Wickets fell at intervals and we couldn't build any meaningful partnerships to challenge Wembley. Ultimately, we were bowled out for 191 in a disappointing batting display. That being said, I am incredibly pleased and proud of the guys for getting as far as we did in a season that threw up a lot of challenges.

I'd like to say thank you to the committee and Justin Warren for giving me the opportunity to captain the team after Christmas, although it was unplanned and unexpected, I thoroughly enjoyed the challenge, and I was able to learn a lot that I hope will lead into next season. Thank you to all the guys who were a part of the 1st grade team, to only have 14 players play 1st grade for the whole season showed that we have a great bunch of guys that will hold us in good shape for the future. In saying that I think the club has a lot of talent coming through and we are in a good position for future years to come. Thank you to everyone involved in the day to day running of the club, without you guys none of this would be possible, all the behind-the-scenes activity doesn't go unnoticed, so I thank you for another great season. I hope we all enjoy the off season and come back hungry to go one step further in 2022/23.

2nd Side Report

I started the season playing in Byford as I have been since 2017 after moving away from the mighty Blues when the commute became too difficult. Early in the season, a chance conversation with my mate and BCC president Chris Pritchard presented the opportunity for my son Tye to play senior cricket at Bentley. One thing led to another and I was lucky enough to return to the club that has been a great part of my life.

It was interesting and fun to catch up with old faces and meet new ones as well, and I was looking forward to easing back into some cricket. My hope for easing back into one of the less serious grades was dashed on the first selection night, as I met skipper Cam Daw for the first time, and he told me that Tye and I would be playing third grade! It was a challenge we were both keen to tackle, and a good chance to return to turf cricket for me.

The side had started strongly with wins against Balcatta and Swanbourne and in my first game back in Round 3, I was lucky enough to walk onto Wyong Oval to take on old foes High Wycombe. The side had players experienced in turf cricket at Bentley in Cam Daw, Chris Pritchard, Mauneeq Solanki, Josh Ericson, Jay Smith and Andrew Stace along with some new faces like Ali Khan, Bobby Banerjee, Bazi Rauf and Tye O'Connell. While we fought hard and controlled periods of play, we were unable to keep the consistency up against a good side which became a theme.

Round 4 saw another game at Wyong against Swan Valley, and we were dominant with the bat as Chris Pritchard and youngster Rex McCormack put on a century stand to rescue the side from danger. Rex followed this up with two wickets with the ball and is a talented young player who I have no doubt will play plenty of first grade at Bentley. His unavailability after Xmas was a huge blow for the side.

In Round 5 we travelled to face perennial contender Murdoch-Melville and fought hard but were ultimately outclassed. Josh Ericson and Mauneeq Solanki were excellent with the ball, it turned out to be the last day of cricket Mauneeq would play for the season with his wife giving birth to their first child on the morning of the second week of the game! Murdoch were gracious enough to let us pick a replacement bat and while many got a start it was again Chris Pritchard who was the sole resistance. An untimely run-out in the middle of our innings and questionable shot selection by some senior players was telling.

We were on the road again in Round 6 against Wembley as promising youngster Ben Whelpdale made his third-grade debut on the back of consistent strong performances in the lower grades. He showed his talent as the side started well being 0-63 and setting the platform for a huge score at one of the competition's best grounds. However, another runout started a slump and Wembley's experienced and disciplined opposition bowling attack restricted us to 152 which was about 75 runs below par and was likely going to be tough to defend. The bowling and fielding were very good, and the attitude didn't wane, but Wembley fought hard early and then cashed in after they'd passed our score. Their final score of 6/288 didn't reflect how competitive we were for the first 65 overs in the field. Fletcher Ghandour and Josh Ericson were outstanding with the ball while Jay Smith and Bazi Rauf also showed promising signs.

We went into the last game before Xmas against Bedford Morley at 3-3 and knowing that a win would either have us in the top four or just outside going into the break. We bowled first in favourable conditions and had them 9-77 as the pace quartet of Ericson, Smith, Ghandour and skipper Daw (giving up the gloves in a brilliant move) had the opposition on the ropes. Unfortunately, their last wicket stand put on a 50-run stand but 127 was very gettable and we knew if we batted well early, we would be in a strong position. We started cautiously and were 1-58 after about 25 overs but fell away drastically and lost in disastrous circumstances. This was a deflating loss and one that really hurt, and ultimately cost us any chance of building momentum after Xmas.

Over the Xmas break, the club was dealt a blow as A grade skipper Manny Hunwick moved interstate for work. To lose a strong cricketer and captain was sure to be a challenge, but it presented an opportunity for Cam Daw to play first grade. He acquitted himself brilliantly, top scoring in a valiant losing Grand Final. With Cam moving out of third grade, I was given the honour of captaining the side after Xmas which was a great thrill. To be back in charge of the second side for the first time since 2012 was a humbling experience and I was hoping we could repeat the side's flag-winning effort in 2009 when we charged home and finished in fourth spot before winning the semi-final and Grand Final.

On top of losing Cam we found out that Rex, Mauneeq and Fletcher were unavailable for the remainder the season which saw us lose four key players but gave opportunities to others. We travelled to Scott Reserve to play High Wycombe and faced an experienced side. We took in a mix of youth and experience and were bolstered by the inclusion of first grade quick Tasman Harris and put a competitive score on the board led by veterans Chris Pritchard and Bobby Banerjee. With the ball we were tight and consistent in the most part, but lapses in concentration resulted in a hard-fought loss. There were plenty of positives to take away from a close contest against a side littered with recent A grade and district cricketers and we knew if we replicated that effort, we would finish the season strongly.

The low point of the latter half of the season came the next week when we made the trek out to Swan Valley on an oppressive day and found ourselves playing on a very subpar pitch, but against an opponent we should have had covered. A slow and measured batting effort saw us score 129 which seemed below par. That soon changed, as inspired bowling by Jay Smith and recalled veteran Tony Magill plus some outstanding fielding reduced Swan Valley to 8-59. A missed opportunity, some poor bowling and the heat of the day took its toll and in the blink of an eye we'd lost the game. It was one of the more disappointing losses I can remember and a real gut punch for a side seeking some positivity and momentum to end the season.

In the penultimate round we returned to Wyong for our last home game for the season with some veterans coming into the side to hopefully add some strength to the team. It was another hot day and we found the going tough against a final's contender, as South Perth set us a target of 210. Glen Hewitt and Ben Whelpdale gave us a solid platform with a patient opening stand but as was the case on a few occasions this season we lost wickets in clumps and fell well short. We remained upbeat and knew that the last round of the season presented a great chance at a win against the bottom of the table team, Subiaco Marist.

Austin Keyte made a promising debut and indicated he could well have a career ahead of him on turf, with him and Ben Whelpdale performing well in a shortened 30 over game as we scored a very competitive 6/144. The hard work and toil of the season paid off with a great win as we bowled the opposition out for 133 with all five bowlers taking two wickets each.

Despite finishing lower on the ladder than we would have liked, the season should be viewed as a positive experience. Young players and those who might not have expected to play so much third grade cricket were exposed to a strong competition. The attitude and positivity never waned, and we fought hard often against the odds, but the reality is we lacked the experience and depth to compete with the better teams. We often found ourselves competing for an hour or two at a time, but not for long enough to produce the results we would have liked.

With the bat, two men at opposite ends of their career were the standouts. The evergreen Chris Pritchard added to an already glowing career record with 281 runs, while youngster Ben Whelpdale came into the team late and proved capable as he averaged almost 30 with the bat. The loss of Cam and Mauneeek hurt the top order, and while the team fought hard, we were unable to put on the partnerships needed to be a finals contender.

With the ball, Jay Smith was the standout as the only bowler to play all games; by the end of the season he was a spearhead and proved to everyone, most importantly himself, that he could thrive at this level. Mauneeek Solanki and Josh Ericson provided able support, while Bazi Rauf showed enough to suggest he has a strong future at this level.

The young core of this team provides plenty of hope for the future – Rex McCormack, Fletcher Ghandour, Ben Whelpdale and Tye O'Connell showed they can all play at this level and each will take away some valuable lessons and should come back hungry to excel next season.

To Mitch and UJ, you both should be proud of incredible efforts to take your seasons to the last day. While you ultimately fell short, your conduct and leadership as two great young men is to be commended. To Manny, likewise you did so much for this club as a leader in a short time and we hope to see you back soon. To Keg and Holly, your roles were difficult as you were often scrambling for players until the last minute, but your humility and positivity is a credit to both of you. To Cam, you have all the makings of a strong captain, but the finals also proved that you are a first-grade cricketer, so onwards and upwards in that aspect.

Thanks to the club for having the confidence in me to guide the team after Xmas. While the results weren't what we would want, I hope I led with positivity and direction and I am confident that everyone who came through third grade can continue to develop and improve in the future. I am sure next season will present the team and club with more opportunities to add more flags to the wall at Wyong!

3rd Side Report

6th grade side were very determined and optimistic this season to come out on top, after losing the semi-final to Subiaco Marist last season. We achieved some great milestones. Captaining two Grand finals is something I'm really proud of and playing my 100th game for the club was a cherished personal achievement. Overall, a great year full of wonderful memories.

Round 1 was a semi-final rematch against Subiaco Marist. After losing the toss we were asked to bowl first. It was a long day on the field for the Bentley bowlers, we knew what we were up against a strong batting line up, Subiaco Marist posting a total of 8/228. An awesome bowling effort kept the opposition very well short of the target finishing their innings scoring only 158 runs. Round 7 against Fremantle Mosman Park was the last game before Christmas and a very crucial must win game for the Blues to qualify for the one day finals. A day we would like to forget as Bentley could not find a weakness in the Marist batting line up with a wave of young talented batsmen coming in one after another. The blues trying their best as the opposition posted a total of 217 runs. It's fair to say the Marist boys out played us in every way and their spin attack proving too strong as always. The Blues falling well short of the target, Subiaco Marist winning by 102 runs. Gurvinder Singh top scoring for the team with a well composed 52 runs.

Last game of the regular season saw us playing against Fremantle Mosman Park. Unfortunately, I've been consistent on one thing this season which is losing the toss. The Blues were sent into bowl on a hot Saturday afternoon. Some exceptional bowling from Tony Magill figures of 3/16 and Balwinder Saini 4/22 held Fremantle to 140. Maaz Hassan opened the batting and played some unorthodox shots smashing 50 runs as top scorer for the team, the Blues winning by 5 wickets.

Qualifying for the One Day grand final was a great achievement for the team. After an up and down season, our hard work paid off. It wasn't going to be easy as we were playing a top team who have been dominant throughout the year, Subiaco Marist. The Blues were sent into bowl, exceptional bowling from VC Tony Magill getting 3/34 and Balwinder Saini 3/22, Marist were under pressure losing quick wickets but a steady middle order partnership accelerated them to 177. The Blues got off to a slow start with wickets tumbling and the required run rate rising. We needed a miracle to win, luckily the rain came down but it wasn't enough to save us. After a quick discussion with the umpires, the Duckworth Lewis method came into play, Bentley requiring 120 runs in 11 overs. A brave partnership between Tony Magill and Mahendra Kalangutkar of 60 runs, but the Blues fell short by 20 runs. Tony Magill top scoring with 41 runs. I wasn't disappointed with the end result but felt proud of my team, it's not easy winning a grand final but we definitely deserved to be there and we gave it our all. Unfortunately, the result didn't go our way but getting to a grand final is an achievement in itself.

Andrew Stace coming into the attack and closing out South Perth's innings all out for 70, the Blues were heading to the grand final!

After 10 long years playing for Bentley, finally reached the big dance. It wasn't easy. A lot of ups and downs but we got there. A grand final versus Subiaco Marist wasn't going to be a walk in the park. A lot of emotions and frustrations in the past, planning numerous tactics to try and get through their strong batting line up, it was definitely an uphill battle for the Blues. I had won the toss and decided to bat first, as always in the past our team has struggled to put runs on the board and with a quality spin attack, Subiaco started off well, taking 4 quick wickets. The Blues were already on the back foot. Good patient batting by Maaz Hassan and Tony Magill in the middle order got us through a tough period before the tail wagged and a handy bit of cameo by Mahendra Kalangutkar and Davinder Singh hitting some well needed boundaries got us to an average score of 148 runs. It was a tough day for our bowlers as the pitch was flat with no sideways movement at all, Subiaco took full advantage of this and played their shots. Unfortunately we could not succeed with the ball and Subiaco chased down the total with ease.

I would like to thank my teammates who have worked hard to get this team to the position we achieved. After many years of trying and failing we finally reached the grand final, that in itself is a big achievement, and my team should feel proud. It wasn't the result we were after but the journey you go through as a team and the bond you create is worth more. I achieved my 100th game for the club and I know there will definitely be another grand final down the line. I would also like to congratulate Mitch Crew and the 1st grade on a spectacular season and reaching the A grade Grand Final! The club should feel proud of what it has accomplished in these last couple of years. To Chris Pritchard our president, I would like to thank you and your committee for all your hard work you guys do during season, it's not easy managing all this and it requires a team of highly dedicated individuals to achieve what you guys have done for the club.

4th Side Report

Sitting down to write this I reflect on the season just gone, it was another roller-coaster of a season, which started off on the wrong foot seeing us bat first and put a miserly target of 8/115 with Ed dancing and Austin Keyte putting on a 50 run opening stand with not much help from the rest of us. Heading into the field we were confident of defending our score, but things didn't quite go to plan with Whitfords winning inside 20 overs, 1 wicket down, leaving us a lot of work to do if we wanted to be competitive this season. However, we discovered some young talent in Carlton Lee and Ben Whelpdale, so things were looking up.

After the first week we were looking to fight back and get our teeth into the season, it saw us take on Swanbourne. The game was a much-improved performance with us bowling first we started off well. A good partnership in the middle saw us concede 220 from our 40 overs, a little more than we were hoping for. We welcomed back the ever-youthful Jason Marlborough and confident of having the runs chased down. Unfortunately, we fell 60 runs short with some even contributions from most players, with Jason and myself leading the way with 30 and 33 respectively.

Round 3 saw us have our first home game of the season, against Western Suburbs, with us bowling first. Some solid contributions from a few others, 49 from another new player, Mahendra Kalangutkar, 42 from Michael Beaucassin and 34* to Jesse Liddle. Nairny's return was looking very good, taking 2/19 from 7 overs, then did his hammy. We were able to take steady wickets all day, with Darren Leng being the pick taking 5/39 from 13 overs seeing us get our first win for the year, bowling Ocean Ridge out for 155.

Next up we were against eventual premiers in North Perth. At home, we bowled first and took regular wickets, holding their strong batting line up to 161, with Darren Leng again the pick of the bowlers. This time taking career best figures of 7/43, from an impressive 26 overs. Heading into bat we were again confident of chasing the runs down, and it started well with Ben Whelpdale scoring another fifty, but we could not help him out, with Tom Watson being the only other person scoring anything of note with 20. In saying that, it came down to the wire with us being bowled out in the 64th over, only 8 runs short.

Round 6 was against Doubleview Carine away. We won the toss and had a bat, Austin continued his great start to the season by rattling off a quick fire 51. He was ably supported by Jason Marlborough (35) and upcoming allrounder Jake Hall (42*), which saw us end on 6/151. Heading into the field we were hoping to continue our improvement. A strong start by Jake Hall (4/44) from 7 overs, Laurie Gray (2/8) from 4 overs and Jithu Krishnamoorthy (2/0) from 3.1 overs sealed a great win, bowling them out for 116.

The last match before the Christmas break saw us take on Curtin Vic Park at home. We lost the toss and were sent into the field, but it saw us put together our best bowling performance for the season with everyone contributing. Wickets were shared around, and we bowled them out for 118. Heading into our innings, we were very confident, but then we lost some early wickets and were 7/70 with only 8 overs or so remaining. So, basically 50 runs, 50 balls, 3 wickets in hand. Jithu and myself managed to get the runs with 8 balls to spare, Jithu hitting the winnings runs, ended up with 27* off as many balls and I finished 26* from 21. This saw us take some great momentum into the break, and looking to push for finals in the new year.

First match back was against Ocean Ridge, a few errors in the field, and not bowling that well saw us concede 202 from our 40 overs. Still confident in chasing it down, we were not up to the task, and were bowled out for 103, putting a dent in our finals chances.

Round 9 was against North Perth, who were on top of the ladder, and a must win game for us if we were to challenge for a finals position. We won the toss, batted first and put up a competitive total of 8/189. Things were going along reasonably well, although we were not doing the one percenters as well as we should have. It saw us fall agonisingly short again, they passed our score 8 wickets down with 4 overs remaining.

Whitfords then made the trek to our home ground, won the toss us put us into the field on a stinking hot day, with us only having 10 players. We ran into some devastating batting, with two blokes making big runs (100 and 71*), we conceded 257 from the 40 overs. It did not help our situation when we lost Darren Leng in the second over (splitting his finger open, it required a dozen or so stitches) – so we only had 9 on the field. I count not fault the team, nobody dropped their head, and I threw them some huge challenges. When our turn to bat came, we started off solidly, with myself scoring 50, but it was always an uphill battle. They bowled and fielded well, and we were held to 135. Again, the one percenters were missing, it is something we will have to work on going into next season.

The final match of the season saw us take on Curtin Vic Park, they needed a win and other results to go their way to make finals. With player shortages towards the end of the season, we knew it was going to be a tough day. We even wrangled Joshua Nairn into playing, after he came down to watch his dad play, and we bowled and fielded well, which held them to 9*193. Wanting a good finish to the season, things were looking up when Simon Cleary put on a bit of a show, smashing 49 from 32 balls. Solid contributions from all, with Ed Daquino being the best of the rest with 30, but again, we fell short. This time by 30 runs, a disappointing finish to the season.

Even though we did quite make finals this season, we weren't that far away. If we can continue to improve and work hard at training we will have a good shot next year.

Seeing some new and exciting players around has made the season very enjoyable, especially young Ben Whelpdale showing what he is made of, being selected in the first side not long after being promoted to the 2's. It shows that he has a lot of promise and I hope to see him back next year, continuing his journey. Jake, Tom and Laurie all brought something new and exciting to the team and will only improve with more games under their belts.

Thanks to the committee for having faith in me to captain again, it has been enjoyable and challenging. I would also like to congratulate Ujjwal and Mitch on making GF's, even though the results didn't go our way, but still a great year and plenty of motivation to come back again for another crack.

To my Vice Captains Geoff Dart and Les Saxon, a big thank you for everything you did over the season and to PC Smith, because it's always been an honour for me to take the field with you mate.

While my biggest thanks are for my beautiful Mrs Holly, not only our Arvo Tea lady but my recovery nurse after every game and for supporting me to come back and play another season.

Fab and Ish steadied for two overs before disaster struck in the first two deliveries of the 31st, Ish dismissed run out and Fab bowled next ball leaving the innings on life support at 8/118.
