Presidents Report

Hello and welcome to the 2023/24 yearbook, thank you for taking the time to read, I hope you enjoy the reports and statistics contained within. I would like to start by thanking our sponsors, patrons and vice-patrons, supporters, volunteers, Life Members, committee and playing groups for their combined efforts in putting the Bentley Cricket Club on the park for our 71st season.

It was a season of difficult decisions for Bentley CC as the club's on-field presence contracted for the first time in 13 years when the call was made to withdraw our 4th XI from the 7th grade in December. This followed on from the very disappointing collapse of our junior's program in September as we went from an anticipated two weekend sides to none. This put us back at square one after 4 years of coaching and development with only a very humble Blasters program running Thursday afternoons. Those families that did participate greatly appreciated the efforts of Darren Leng, Cam McNab, Jay Smith and Lewis Hughes who donated their time to make the experience as enriching and positive as possible for the kids. At times the coaches were having as much fun as the participants!

Results-wise four finals appearances for one win but no flag is an improvement on last season. The club hosting just our second top grade grand final was a fantastic achievement from Mitch Crew's Ones but sadly we fell short of taking the pennant. The return of coach DT who had previously taken charge in 2018/19 and 2019/20 gave the top side the edge to fight back from 'almost relegated' last season to 'almost 4th' this season on the main ladder and that is something we can be very positive about. The next generation of Bentley top graders have been emerging for some years and are now racking up some big numbers, a group who I'm sure will taste success in the seasons to come. Training attendance towards the end of the season was increasingly poor from all teams and is something we hope can be reversed in 2024/25.

I have many people to thank but first mention goes to our executive committee in treasurer Darren Leng, VP Cam McNab and new secretary Tasman Harris. Everyone took on multiple roles to keep the club running and the big efforts of the Exec contributing hours at home and down at Wyong outside of training and match times are not realised by our wider membership. Andrew Stace shouldered the burden of first-year captaincy as well as finding the required number of players every Thursday in the second half of the season as Chairman of Selectors.

The other major contributors off-field were for mine Tony Magill, Steve Cairns and Steve Shearing. Tony was an able member of the committee, sourced our match balls saving the club thousands, compiled the statistics, kept a close eye on PlayHQ, offered up a room in his home the club's UK recruit Lewis Hughes and often was one of the last out the door on a Thursday or Saturday night. No favour was too large to ask.

Steve Cairns inexplicably expressed his disappointment he'd not contributed enough this season despite attending and running net sessions without fail and offering whatever assistance he could at club functions and committee meeting, all while on one good foot.

Steve Shearing continues to coordinate the Southern Outlaws O/45s Vets team who call Wyong home. He is also our spokesperson and tireless advocate with the City of Canning staff, Councilors, Mayor, and members of Parliament as he continues to push our turf training wicket proposal through the tortuous applications process. As of March 2024 we have put in our second attempt at getting the project approved and with the help of the City of Canning and our learnings from the first attempt, we hope to have a big announcement to make over the 2024 winter.

It has been an at times stressful experience as first year president but ultimately a satisfying one, I put that down to the fellowships enjoyed with the Bentley CC members throughout the season. After all, what is a cricket club for? See you all again next season.

Chairman of Selectors Report

From the outset, 2023/24 proved to have its challenges when it came to getting a squad together and getting 55, and then 44 on the park each Saturday. After a lacklustre 2022/23 on the recruitment front, it was a tale of *deja vu* – if it wasn't friends of friends committing elsewhere, it was our number one target shattering his arm in his first football game of the season (the injury occurred near the wicket block at Wyong, which made that incident the closest we've come to getting a major recruit on the pitch in the past two seasons).

Concerns about work schedules and planned overseas sojourns for key players was also an issue when formulating our squad, and a small, but important nucleus of recently involved senior players being lost to father time didn't help, but a last-minute recruitment from the UK in Wolverhampton's Lewis Hughes, found us a reliable middle-order bat which would prove to be invaluable when availability became particularly challenging. A couple of converts from Wyong's winter tenants in the Canning Tigers shored up the bowling stocks (an area in which we've traditionally struggled, of course), and with new corflutes on the neighbouring roadways alerting the locals to our presence, we eventually swelled our squad with an abundance of fresh faces.

1st Grade, under the returning leadership of Mitch Crew, had an up-and-down season, invariably missing a key member of the side most weeks but holding a spot in the top four for much of the season. Prior to Christmas, the side put together a mostly strong series of performances, the highlight being a successful chase of 318 against Balcatta at home in the first two-day fixture of the season. Whilst the middle and end portions of the season did see some wobbles, the club did memorably knock off a then-undefeated Murdoch in a one-day Semi Final at Murdoch, before succumbing to a dogged Balcatta in the OD Grand Final by 3 wickets. Having staved off relegation in the final round of 2022/23, to be in touching distance of finals until the very end of 2023/24 was a great recovery, as our 1's once again punched above their weight and showed great character – a couple of missed opportunities to put sides away was the difference in the end. 16 players represented the top side (plus Ujjwal Bhan, who brought his unique brand of bugger-all as an 11B for one game) and all acquitted themselves well – the return of Manuel Hunwick to Perth and a full season in 1st Grade from Matt Lockyer saw the two of them top the runs list with 440 and 380 respectively – Tasman Harris topping the wickets with 31, including a near-match turning 4-28 in the OD GF loss. Despite missing multiple matches owing to a trip to Pakistan, talisman Awais Mehdi picked up 25 wickets at 19 to go with 365 runs at 40.56. But for two hammerings at the hands of Swanbourne, a good season with some room for improvement.

The potential of our 2nd XI was a complete unknown going into the season – a few 2nd XI regulars from the previous year's side not returning alongside a few stalwarts being unable to commit saw the core of our most recent 3rd XI, led by Ujjwal Bhan, elevated to the 2nd XI for their first full-time foray into turf cricket. Unfortunately, the cricket often didn't live up to the standard of competition, but some fascinating results ensued throughout the season. The trademark result of the season was probably the two-day meeting with Balcatta at Jones Paskin – whilst the 1's chased down 318, the 2's did their best to turn a close-run first innings win into an outright loss, but a herculean blockathon from Bazi Rauf (0 off 51) and captain Bhan (8 off 44) ultimately thwarted Balcatta. More than once, the team was able to stare an outright loss in the face and declare that it was not this day, but by the time Round 12 rolled around, the wheels finally fell into motion for the batting order, and the team posted its best effort with the bat all season, batting almost the entire day after falling to 3-9 to post 206 in pursuit of 240. The selection carousel was in full effect, with 31 players playing in at least one match, and at the end of the day, there is no doubt that 11 people turned up to a 3rd Grade fixture and played cricket. Except for that one time at Gil Fraser Reserve. And don't ask about the One Day Semi Final.

If the 2nd XI's biggest issue was its ability to bat time and put a score on board, unfortunately there wasn't a whole lot of reinforcements on hand from the 3rd XI. Led by yours truly, the 3rd XI had an almost entirely different side to the previous couple of years as those guys were now playing in the 2's – this did mean opportunities presented for players to stamp their name on a regular spot, but with the younger players being heavily bowler-dominant and many newcomers to the club playing longer form cricket for the first time, this did mean that there was a major on a couple of players to score the bulk of the runs, and batting time proved to be a real challenge for the first half of the season. With an increasingly crippling lack of availability due to injuries or travel, fielding a competitive side in the lower three grades did prove difficult in the first half of the year – by season's end, 42 players played at least one match in the 3rd XI. However, the team never threw in the towel, and after the 4th side was folded due to lack of numbers, was much more competitive without being able to get the results, even with a couple of the original 3rd XI players being sequestered by the OD4's to strengthen their side for a finals tilt. Beyond a once-in-a-lifetime 8th wicket stand in our two-dayer against Bedford Morley, we weren't belted most weeks, but the opposition was just a little bit better than us in some facet of every match. Still, we had fun as a team and took solace in the little wins – I hope to see everyone back next year.

Unfortunately, the 4th XI had to be folded after just 6 rounds – week to week availability proved such a challenge that the club had to forfeit a two dayer and was simply aiming to find 11 able bodies for several weeks. Whilst the highlights were few in the games played, 4's captain and club treasurer Darren Leng sank the boot into Applecross one more time, scoring his first ever hundred after previously taking 7-wicket hauls in consecutive seasons against that side. Those regulars from the 4th XI folded into the 3rd XI seamlessly after the withdrawal and acquitted themselves well – Michael Beaucasin fought hard with the bat against the most hostile bowlers in 5th Grade, whilst Campbell Browne took his first wickets for the club in the 4th XI before becoming a bigger threat in the 3rd XI as the season went on, saving his best effort for the near-burglary against Western Suburbs in Round 12 with three utterly majestic castlings.

The One Day side went about their work with finals on captain Les Saxon's mind. Whilst it can be hard to predict on any given week what will happen in the One Day grades, the OD4's got most of the way to the promised land. beating every team above them and losing to all below them on the final ladder. The selected sides did differ wildly from week to week with 41 players used across the season, and this proved to be a problem when finals rolled around – multiple regulars were lost to junior cricket priorities and injuries and illnesses combined to cost stand-in skipper several of his preferred eleven, the side went on to be caned by Bassendean in their semi-final at Jubilee Reserve. Special mention goes to 15-year-old Bohan Kane-Slocombe, who played almost a full season with the OD4's, finishing with 237 runs and 15 wickets, also making a one-game cameo with dad Chris in the 3rd side where he scored an invaluable 45 off 139 to set up our best total of the season. The OD4's also played host to a rare triple-generational occasion with captain Les Saxon took to the field with son Shane and grandson Tate against North Beach Carine CC in Round 7.

Thanks to everyone who came along to be a part of Season 2023/24, and thanks especially to those who came to training, made themselves available and paid their fees – it was a challenging season, but brighter days are ahead. Thanks to David Taylor for giving up his time to coach us despite the logistical challenges, and to Stephen Cairns for marshalling the nets at training – it should be acknowledged both men put their own health issues aside to be a part of this wonderful club. Also to the committee for keeping things running as smoothly as possible.

1st Side Report

After a tough 2022/2023 season for all grades, there was optimism that the 2023/2024 season would be greatly improved on field. David Taylor (DT) returned to the club as head coach for 23/24, after leaving to coach Joondalup CC and Melville CC in the WACA competition. His experience and knowledge were invaluable to the whole club as we continued to search for continuity and growth. Manuel Hunwick also returned from his Melbourne Hiatus, giving us some much-needed batting strength at the top of the order. With one last push to strengthen our batting line up, we went on an international hunt, recruiting Lewis Hughes from Wightwick and Finchfield CC in the Staffordshire County League. With these additions, plus our core group from the season prior suiting up again, the squad looked to have some much-needed stability leading into the season.

The season started off strongly, firstly heading to Kalamunda where the team put together a solid performance to get a win on the board. Round two and the team headed down to Fremantle to take on Fremantle-Mosman Park CC. Again, a solid all-round performance, enough to log a second win and get the season off to a winning start. Special Mention to Awais Mehdi for scoring a 50 in round 1 and 5 wickets in round 2, getting his campaign off to a strong start. Round 3 was our first hiccup of the season, and a wake-up call that the competition is tough and if you're not at your best, you will get caught out. Facing Swanbourne at home, we were able to put 176 on the board in our 40 overs, it was a competitive score no doubt about that. Unfortunately, the bowling and fielding wasn't up to standard, and Swanbourne were able to chase the score in 32 overs, only losing one wicket in the process.

Round 4 had us searching for the record books, with a huge scoring game against Balcatta at home. Balcatta batting first, amassed a big 317 from their 80 overs, a challenging score to chase given the magnitude. I was very impressed with how our top order attacked the challenge with contributions from everyone in the top 4 getting us to a winnable position. Travis Keys scoring 67, Matt Lockyer 82, Manuel 50 and Awais 35 getting us to 3-221. Cameron Daw chipped in with an important 20, but a couple of cheap wickets suddenly had us 8-284 and the win looking further and further away. Up stepped Adam Palumbo and Tasman Harris, with an unbeaten 35 run partnership they got us over the line, with Adam hitting the winning runs with 3 balls to spare! What a win, so important for our season and a massive confidence boost to show that we can win any game if we bring the right attitude.

Round 5 we were away against Wembley, always a tough assignment. Bowling first, they scored a competitive 217, but it could have been a lot more if it weren't for Awais and Matt Lockyer bowling in a fantastic partnership post Tea. They were duly rewarded with Matt picking up 3 wickets and Awais 4. Manuel was the standout with the bat, making a patient 93, falling just short of the magical 3 figure score. Although a mini collapse, we scraped over the line 9 down and recorded our 4th win of the season.

Round 6 was an easier victory, bowling North Perth out for 112 before chasing them 3 down with 21 overs remaining. Tasman Harris picked up 4 wickets before Awais made an unbeaten 74. Round 7 we come up against a struggling Swan Valley. Batting first, Matt Lockyer set a strong platform with a strong 70, we made a competitive 176 from our 40 overs. Swan Valley put the pressure on and started their innings strongly, but Adam Palumbo bowled some brilliant middle innings overs, picking up 4 wickets and helping us secure the win.

The final round before Christmas saw us up against Murdoch at Murdoch. The best team of the competition the last 2-3 seasons. This was a great challenge for us to see where we were as a group. MUMCC scoring 214 from their 40 overs, always had the upper hand and were too clinical with their bowling to ever give us a chance. Again, Matt Lockyer did what he could from the top with 37, but had minimal help as we were bowled out for 151 in 37 overs. Although a loss, we went into Christmas with a 6-2 record and second on the ladder. A great platform for the remaining 4 regular season games.

After Christmas was a lot more disappointing for our 1st grade group, never able to find our pre-Christmas form. Round 9 we faced FMPCC again, and this time the result was reversed. They made 235 and we were on target to chase it down, before some brain fades and poor batting halted our progress. Ultimately bowled out for 189 with still 12 overs to bat. Manuel made 71 but had little help as wickets continued to fall around him.

Round 10 saw us up against Swanbourne, and much the same as round 3, we were outclassed and outplayed for most of the game to record our 3rd straight loss. Batting first, the top order was got us off to a good start, but we weren't able to sustain it. A couple of middle to lower order cameos got us to a reasonable 217 but it was never enough against a strong batting line up. Swanbourne chasing down our score with 7 wickets remaining and 20 overs spare.

There was positive news though, as we'd performed so strongly pre-Christmas, we had qualified for the one-day semi-finals. We found ourselves up against Murdoch again and were eager to turn our fortunes around in a big game for the club. Batting first, Awais made a stunning 84 not out with some help from Travis, we posted 186 from our 40 overs. Murdoch were always in the game as it see-sawed in momentum. With some strong fielding and excellent bowling, we were able to keep the pressure on long enough to restrict them to 175 from their 40. A great win for the team and a grand final birth just a fortnight away.

Round 11 we were at Bassendean, who weren't having a great season but could beat most teams. Our bowling and fielding were very poor week one and they subsequently scored 251. Tasman Harris fought hard all day and was rewarded with 5 wickets, Adam also chipping in with 3. Our batting innings was interrupted with Rain, making the task even harder as we only had 60 overs to score the runs. As the game went on, it became more evident that we wouldn't be able to win, so we opted to bat it out for a draw and secure 5 points to keep our season alive. Ending on 7-155 from our 60 overs.

Grand final day was upon us, and everyone was buoyed by the excitement the opportunity presented. We were up against Balcatta who are always a tough opponent. Batting first, we didn't get the start we wanted and at 5-81 we were struggling to have a competitive score. Jonty Saini scored a quick 28, and with some lower order assistance, we posted 161. Below par but defendable. Tasman Harris bowled his heart out and almost dragged us over the line with 4 wickets, but ultimately, we weren't good enough. Balcatta winning with 4 overs to spare and securing the one-day Premiership. Although disappointing, we were proud of how our one-day season had gone and will look to go one better next season. Our final game of the season was against bottom of the ladder Kalamunda, and we needed to win outright to make it through to finals. We came so close in the second innings, defending 150 from 34 overs, we had them 7-114 but couldn't get the final wickets. Ultimately losing, we fell 4 points short of the finals and finished 5th on the ladder. After a strong start to the season, we fell away and paid the price. Although disappointing, it fills me with confidence that with the core group sticking together for another season, we have the structure in place to make finals next season and push for our 4th flag.

I would like to finish by thanking everyone that makes this club run, there is a tremendous amount of work that goes into every season, and it doesn't go unnoticed by most. Thanks to DT for his support this season, not only for me but to the whole playing group. Your knowledge and coaching prowess have no doubt helped us improve as a club. We have a great club culture; we all love to play together and celebrate our success as a group. I can't wait for next season and see where we can go with this group.

3rd Side Report

Season 23/24 proved to be a challenging season at Bentley; the 3rd XI certainly had more than its fair share. Resuming our place in 5th Grade after a semi final exit at the hands of our seemingly tri-annual tormentors - Subiaco Marist's finest Sri Lankan hard wicket heroes - mitigating factors (primarily the porting of approximately half that semi-final XI to the 2nd side as the club sought to relitigate the captaincy, and therefore, selection policy) resulted in an almost entirely different team turning up to face the old enemy at Centenary Reserve for Round 1.

Having spent the previous three seasons relentlessly ribbing my dear friend and previous 3rd XI captain about his shortcomings as a leader, the opportunity presented itself to put my money where my mouth was (and hopefully dodge any ex-1st Grade quicks when walking out to bat). Jokes aside, as a third generation Bentley cricketer, the opportunity to captain a Bentley side has been a privilege – thanks to Supreme Leader Smith for the opportunity, and to the scores of better candidates who've moved from the club since I first arrived.

With lieutenants Jason Marlborough and Tony Magill as vice-captains and an assortment of the third-best soldiers our pre-season sessions dished up, we (certainly I) stared down our greatest foes, optimistic that 2023/24 presented our best chance to finally bring the Bhan-Peirir Trophy to the Home of Cricket. That optimism was dashed somewhat when I walked out to bat at 6-10 in the 5th over in pursuit of 242, but I've always been a relentlessly positive person, so I wasn't about to let our 267th annihilation at Subi's hands dampen my enthusiasm, especially after being dropped half a dozen times on my way to 51.

As the season progressed, it was clear quite quickly that the 3rd XI found itself in uncharted territory for the Blues – bowlers for days, but a critical scarcity of batsmen with the patience and technique for long-form cricket. In all, 42 players made their way into the 3rd XI for at least one match, so the lineup was as settled as Josh Ericson's stomach after going within 400m of a jalapeno.

As the season progressed to the Christmas break, runs on the board proved our Achilles heel – the aberration being our first and only victory over Bedford Morley in Round 3, a 5-run victory defending 197, courtesy of twin 65's from coach David Taylor and Keiran Smith.

Ironically, it was the folding of the 4th XI that strengthened my side to a degree. Post-Christmas, we put together some much-improved performances without pulling off a victory – 2024 was summed up by the return fixture against Bedford, where a Darren Leng 7-for had them 7-77 chasing 153, only to finish the day 7-306 after a slew of hacking, slashing and catch-dropping saw the least likely twin centurions ever make most of us question if cricket was the sport for us. We also finished off our season by reducing last years' premiers, Western Suburbs, to 8/103 chasing 166, but just couldn't quite get it done.

Whilst a one-win season isn't ideal, there were little wins almost every week and many who improved out of sight as the season went on. From Mitch Curwood, who started his first season in several years with 18 wides and 3 no balls in his first 7 overs, then finished it with a Starc-esque spell of left arm swing. Likewise, Campbell Browne was thrown in the deep end after the folding of our 4's but got better every week and will only become more of a weapon with the ball in time. Shout out to Gauravsingh Chauhan, who quietly played some seriously dogged innings after an inauspicious start, and never gave less than 1,000,000% in the field. I'll also never forget watching Harsh Rana walk in at 6/51 in our first two-dayer against Swanbourne, still about 80 runs, 20-odd overs and three fragile wickets away from an outright loss, and summarily smoke 74 from 40 balls, with 8 of the biggest sixes I've seen hit at Centenary.

Thanks to Darren Leng who, when he could get himself out of the abyss that was the 2nd XI middle order post-4's fold, provided great support and a cool head (particularly in my absence when an opposing captain behaved in quite uncaptainly fashion). Just keep taking 7-fors and eventually one will have to be in a winning side?

Overall, thanks to the guys who continued to rock up, do the right things well and refuse to let this stupid sport get the better of us! I've always said no one hates cricket more than cricketers, but I think it's fair to say we still had fun in the face of some utterly not-fun afternoons. Who knows what next season looks like, but even if it all goes to hell in a handbasket inside the first month again, this club is full of quality people and it's enough to keep me coming back for more punishment season after season.

4th Side Report

One Day Side Report

Bentley continued in OD4 this season, WASTCA having restructured we were no longer in the lowest OD grade as two OD5 grades were introduced for the first time. To some dismay the OD4 Premiers from 22/23 had remained in the grade and Balcatta were to prove too strong for the challengers again in season 2023/24.

Les Saxon was appointed skipper with the hope of being able to play with grandson Tate most Saturday afternoons. This was not to be the case unfortunately as Tate's form in Districts U15s meant he was selected in the Seniors more often than not. Les was able to recruit Tate's U15s teammate Bohem Kane-Slocombe and his father Chris Slocombe, these two proving to be the backbone of the team most weeks with Bo opening the batting and Chris the bowling. Unfortunately, an injury ruled out the evergreen Les from January onwards, and Jay Smith recovering from a shoulder reconstruction unable to bowl or throw overarm took over captaincy thereafter.

It was certainly a season for family connections, the Smith's played together before PC's departure at Christmas for the grey nomad life. OD team stalwart Simon Cleary recruited son Jack who brought great enthusiasm to his first season in senior cricket. Greg and Josh Nairn played some fixtures together before Greg was ruled out in November for medical reasons. Michael Vlismas taking to the field with son Tom on one occasion and the very inexperienced Sethi twins played their first ever match of cricket as well. The family theme reached it's peak in round 7 as Les, son Shane and grandson Tate all played in the same match, a likely first-time occurrence for Bentley if not the Association.

The team did have some standout performances and some exceedingly poor ones (including our semi final) in the ebb and flow of the season including one forfeit. We won a match by a run (R5 v Kalamunda) and we lost a match by 1 wicket on the last ball (R15 v Subiaco Marist). We defeated all but Subi (who finished 7th) and lost to every team in the grade. Our fortunes were improved by the demise of the 4th XI and 'priority picks' of Ausin Keyte and Tony Magill to sure up a finals push. Tony would have won every award in the grade had it not been for the lateness of his inclusion, consecutive scores of 80 he was often the team's prize wicket and taking 13 wickets @13 from his 9 matches. Bohem led the way opening, carrying his bat on one occasion and finishing the season with 237 @29 for the average award, he also took the most wickets with 15. Michael Vlismas was a late revelation as top order bat, producing our best innings of the season to bury the eventual premiers Balcatta in R16 as we stormed to victory to rekindle the hope of making finals. Vlis finished with the batting aggregate award of 262 runs.

Our more memorable matches were:

Our first win in Round 3 against Western Suburbs at College Park: four run-outs from the opposition two of which were more comedy than cricket. In the chase Mitch Curwood 41* at three and Cleary 50 from 31 balls saw us home with 8 overs to spare chasing a target of 133.

Round 5 hosting Kalamunda, Bohen bowling the last over of the day and Kala needing 4 for victory with one wicket left. It came down to 2 needed off 2 when Bo collected a would be single to tie the scores, threw to wicketkeeper Ben Wood and square leg put the finger up, the batsman short of his ground. One of the best things I can recall seeing on a cricket field for a long time.

Round 12 hosting Western Suburbs, after four losses in a row it looked to be five as we were 7/64 after 16 overs in pursuit of 174 for victory. Tony Magill was assured at one end to guide the team home making a brilliant 80*, a 91 run stand with Captain Smith setting a new record and then debutant Mehmood another 19 run partnership as we won by 2 wickets 2.2 overs remaining.

Round 13 hosting top of the ladder Bassendean, a team who had smashed us on two previous occasions, we were a player short on a 42 degree day things did not bode well for Bentley. Temperature saw the opposition skipper agree to a 20 over a side match with Bentley gifted the chance to bat first. Magill again dispatched them to all parts to make 82. In a very tight finish with a fielding position no-ball call in the last over we had won by 5 runs. Bassendean never quite got in front of the run rate despite having 7 wickets in hand.

Round 16 travelling out to Aintree Eglington to face the raucous Balcatta hell-bent on a finals campaign, our first 20 overs of the match was poor as Balcatta went to drinks at 0/71. With rain about the bowlers were facing challenging conditions and came to the good, our last 20 overs in the field going for 8/71. In the chase Bo and Vlis got us off to the perfect start, Bo in particular copping verbals for his methodical approach but it worked - the opening stand worth 59 from 17 overs. Vlis stayed there and continued to find boundary after boundary as the opposition turned from verbally going us to attacking each other. By the time Vlis fell for 76 the damage had been done with the score at 132 in the 32nd over. Two quick wickets fell but Simon and Tony got it done as we won comfortably in the end to send Balcatta into soul-searching mode which made the beers taste even better.

Our semifinal appearance against Bassendean at Jubilee was obligatory only, one felt we would have been happy to call it a season after soundly defeating Kalamunda in the last round to make it into the 4. After scraping a team together on permits and pleas, the highlight was Wingnut opening the bowling and watching the batsman walk past it to disturb the furniture for one last time.

Thanks to everyone who was able to fill in or recruit friends and family to help us fill the team. Our season can best be summarised in one word, which was emphasised by Les at the start of every match: enjoyment.
