FINAL EDITORIAL
1991 - 1992

SECOND GRADE

WITH FOUR GAMES REDUCED TO ONE DAY FIXTURES, AND ONE GAME ABANDONED DUE TO RAIN, THE TOP SIDE, I FEEL, WERE UNABLE TO REALLY COME TO GRIPS WITH OUR NEW TURF WICKET AT ALL SAINTS COLLEGE. I BELIEVE THIS, COMBINED WITH PLAYERS NOT BEING FIT DUE TO INJURIES, AND HAVING PLAYERS' WORK COMMITMENTS TAKE PRECEDENCE (AS THEY SHOULD) WERE JUST SOME OF THE FACTORS TO CAUSE THE UP AND DOWN SEASON FOR THE THIS SIDE.

FIFTH GRADE

THE CLUB'S HOPE OF A SIDE BEING IN THE FINAL FOUR AT THE END OF 1991/92 SEASON RESTED ON THE SHOULDERS OF THE 5th GRADE SIDE WITH PLAYERS WHO HAD THE ABILITY TO PERFORM IN THAT GRADE. BUT AS HISTORY WILL RECORD, THE 5TH GRADE SIDE WERE UNABLE TO PERFORM THIS FEAT. NOT FROM WANT OF TRYING BY ANY MEMBER OF THAT SIDE AT ANY TIME, BUT LADY LUCK, OR THE FALL OF THE BALL, WHAT EVER TERM YOU WISH TO USE, WAS NOT WITH BENTLEY'S 5TH GRADE SIDE IN THE 1991 /92 SEASON.

I AM NOT MAKING ANY EXCUSES AS MY PERSONAL PERFORMANCE AFTER CHRISTMAS WAS, TO SAY THE LEAST, VERY POOR, HOWEVER, PEOPLE WHO DID GET THE RUNS ON THE BOARD SHOULD NOT GO WITHOUT MENTION. CAPTAIN TIMMY SHEPHERD DID NOT HAVE ONE OF HIS BEST SEASONS, BUT BATTED MOST OF THE SEASON WITH AN INJURED BACK AND TALLIED 118 RUNS FROM 8 INNINGS. GLEN DAVIES "THE CAPTAIN OF VICE" (ONLY JOKING FLURO) 120 FROM 9 INNINGS, " YOURS TRULY " 180 FROM 10 GAMES (WISH WE COULD SCRUB THE LAST FOUR DIGS IN 5TH GRADE), TONY MAGILL 140 FROM 6 INNINGS, AND IAN DICKERSON 206 FOR THE SEASON, A TOTAL HE WAS AIMING FOR, BUT I KNOW HE WOULD HAVE LIKED TO HAVE GOT MORE UNDER HIS BELT.

MAYBE NOT AS IMPRESSIVE IN THE SCORE BOOK AT THE END OF THE YEAR BUT KNOCKS THAT WERE VITAL IN WINNING GAMES OR SAVING FACE WERE: JOHN FORD'S 26 NOT OUT IN THE LAST GAME, BRIAN WILLIAMS' 41 IN THE RAIN AT WEMBLEYDOWNS (ANY OTHER DAY BRIAN'S SCORE IN FINE CONDITIONS WOULD HAVE BEEN 60 +), MATT HARMER'S 89 & ANDREW HAYWARD'S 59 AGAINST WEMBLEY, GLEN DAVIES' 63 ALSO IN THE LAST GAME. BUT THE TWO PLAYERS WHOSE INNINGS STAND OUT IN MY MIND ARE SIMON MAGILL'S 23* & COUSIN TONY MAGILL'S 50. WITH WICKETS FALLING AND BENTLEY LOOKING AT ONE STAGE TO BE LUCKY TO MAKE 50 IN TOTAL, SIMON & TONY HELD BACK A WHITFORDS' ATTACK THAT WOULD NOT GIVE UP. THIS ALLOWED BENTLEY'S 5TH GRADE SIDE AT LEAST REACH A THREE FIGURE SCORE.

AND THE BOWLERS WHO WORKED WITH OUT LUCK AT TIMES OR TRIED SOME TIMES TOO HARD TO BLAST A BATSMAN OUT CANNOT GO WITH OUT MENTION. AGAIN IAN DICKERSON 211-67-441-24, JOHN WILLIAMS 111-16-310-19, BROTHER BRIAN 91-32-175-8, TONY FISK 93-33-188-10 AND IN THE LATTER HALF OF THE SEASON MARK LUKAN 67-19-136-7. AS YOU CAN SEE, LARGE QUANTITIES OF OVERS FOR LITTLE REWARD, BUT LION HEARTED EFFORTS BY NOT ONLY THESE BOWLERS BUT THE OTHERS WHO GAVE THEIR ALL FOR THE 5TH GRADE SIDE.

ALSO THE EFFORTS IN THE FIELD, BERNARD SAVY'S EFFORTS WITH THE GLOVES GIVEN TO HIM AT SHORT NOTICE, SIMON MAGILL BOUNDARY RIDING, JOHN WILLIAMS GULLY FIELDING, LLOYD DUNGEY AT BACKWARD SQUARE, MICHAEL KENRICK'S CONTINUAL EFFORTS TO IMPROVE, DAVID BROWN, THE EVEREADY 12TH MAN YOU CAN RELY ON TO BE THERE WHEN YOU HAVE A PLAYER DOWN IN THE FIELD, AND SWOOP DAVIES WHO I BELIEVE HAS FOUND HIS TRUE SLOT IN THE FIELD AS A WICKET KEEPER.

SIXTH GRADE

WITH A SIDE THAT LOOKED NOTHING LIKE THE TEAM THAT PLAYED IN THE SEVENTH GRADE 1990-1991 GRAND FINAL AGAINST SHENTON PARK, NEWLY APPOINTED CAPTAIN PHIL KENRICK (HIS FIRST TIME AS A CAPTAIN FOR THE CLUB) HAD A DIFFICULT TASK TO SAY THE LEAST, TO KEEP THE SIDE IN SIXTH GRADE. HAVING BEEN THE CAPTAIN OF THE SEVENTH GRADE SIDE ON THREE SEPARATE OCCASIONS MYSELF, I KNOW IT'S NEVER EASY, AND PHIL WITH THE LIMITED RESOURCES IN PLAYER NUMBERS AND, ONE MUST BE FAIR, PLAYER SKILLS, AT HIS DISPOSAL DID AN EXCELLENT JOB, NOT ONLY FOR THE CLUB BUT THE PLAYERS. MANY TIMES LEFT WITH THE TASK OF ENSURING THAT PLAYERS HAD LIFTS OR PLAYERS KNEW WHERE THEY HAD TO GO, PHIL'S TELECOM TAXI DID THE JOB OF CARRYING PLAYERS TO AND FROM WHERE EVER THE GROUND WOULD BE. HIS EFFORTS IN TAKING ON THIS RESPONSIBILITY DID NOT GO UNNOTICED BY THE CLUB'S COMMITTEE, AND A PERSONAL THANKYOU FROM ME.

STILL, THERE ARE SOME GOOD EFFORTS FROM PLAYERS IN A SIDE THAT FOUGHT HARD ALL YEAR. BATTING WISE KEVIN MAGILL 170 FROM 10 GAMES, LEROY CATCHPOLE 169 & PETER ROACH 142 FROM 9 GAMES, GREG DICKERSON 131 FROM 8 INNINGS, CAPTAIN PHIL KENRICK 124 AND GARY FORMICA 238 FROM JUST 8 INNINGS.

THE BOWLERS, LIKE THE 5TH GRADE, HAD A LOT OF WORK BUT GOOD EFFORTS SHOULD BE MENTIONED BY STEVE KING WHO BOWLED 132-25-419-24, LEROY CATCHPOLE 110-23-326-16, "FOXY" FARRALL 87-10-309-14, GARY FORMICA 56-10-203-6, PETER ROACH 43-2-189-8. ADD TO THIS THE MANY MORE WHO BOWLED LIKE GLEN McCULLOCH, RAY BAND, PHIL KENRICK AND GREG DICKERSON WHO ALL GAVE 100 + %.

MAYBE THE REAL DEFICIENCY IN THE SIDE AT THE START OF THE YEAR WAS THE FIELDING OF THE PLAYERS. NOT ABLE TO CONCENTRATE AND AT TIME LAPSES IN CONCENTRATION CAUSED POOR CATCHING IN THE GAMES. AS PHIL WILL STATE THIS COST THEM AT LEAST TWO OR MORE GAMES. HOWEVER, ONE WOULD NOT DOUBT THE 6TH GRADE PLAYERS' WILLINGNESS AT TUESDAY AND THURSDAY TRAINING NIGHTS TO IMPROVE THEIR GAME, AND SOME OF THE SENIOR MEMBERS OF THE BENTLEY CRICKET CLUB WERE OFTEN PUT TO SHAME AT THE ATTENDANCE RECORDS OF MANY OF THESE JUNIOR PLAYERS.

THE FATE OF THE SIDE IS FAR FROM DECIDED, AS CLUBS WISHING TO NOMINATE ADDITIONAL SIDES FOR THE 1992-1993 SEASON COULD, WITH AN OUTSIDE CHANCE, STOP THE 5TH GRADE SIDE FROM DROPPING BACK INTO SEVENTH GRADE. ONE CAN ONLY HOPE, AND KEEP OUR FINGERS CROSSED THAT THIS COULD HAPPEN.
