GRAND FINAL REPORT

BENTLEY 'B' TEAM BUNGLE THE BIG ONE OR ~~WE~~ LOST !

It would be easy to avoid doing this match report on the 4th Grade Suburban Turf final between Bentley and Tuart Hill. However, club members (those present) received a detailed report on the semi-final victory, so to close our eyes to the final might appear somewhat churlish. In short, Bentley scored 252, a total which Tuart Hill bettered 6-260.

In retelling the story of the match, we will give you some good news and some bad news. Let's start with the good news. BILL HARMER won the toss and decided to bat. The Murdoch University wicket was evenly grassed and it looked to be a good strip (which it subsequently proved to be). The first day belonged to Bentley. At stumps, with a score of 4-200, the grade winners had reason to be quite satisfied. PHIL ROBERTS again proved what a consistent and reliable performer he is by striking 36 authoritative runs. Skipper BILL had a charmed life, particularly early, but finally came to grips with the bowling and bludgeoned 52 valuable runs. RON FERNANDEZ provided a tremendous foundation for the side by batting between 2 and 6 p.m. for an unconquered 56 runs - an epic of concentration. In the final hour, he received great support from JOHN WILLIAMS who had reached 29 by stumps.

Sunday 10 a.m. saw RON and JOHN go to the crease. Knowing that 20 more overs could be bowled before the innings closed. A combination of tight bowling, the new ball and an eagerness for runs saw Bentley's wickets tumble at regular intervals, but the final total of 252 looked formidable. RON took his overnight score to 69, whilst JOHN became the third batsman to reach his half century. The general reaction was that the batsmen had done their job.

Bentley took the field and TONY MALINS was soon into action when he spreadeagled the opener's stumps. A defiant partnership, however, for the second wicket saw Tuart Hill reach 1-74 by lunch. The first hour after lunch belonged to Bentley with TONY capturing a further 2 wickets and his cricketing cohort, GEORGE WOODHEAD, (aided by some smart keeping by PETER FARRALL) also got into the act with 3 wickets. Certainly, with the opposition at 6-128, Bentley could envisage a pennant on the wall back at the club. However, no one anticipated a GREEN SPARROWHAWK swooping on the coveted prize to whisk it away to the greener climes of Tuart Hill. A stunned and bemused Bentley side tramped from the field minus the pennant that the players and supporters so desperately wanted. TONY with 3-64 and GEORGE with 3-77 were the successful bowlers. Overall, the bowling had lacked its usual venom and tightness, plus the fielders did not really give the bowlers the support they needed. Nevertheless, congrats go to the players for their effort in making the final. J.W.

As has often been the case in recent seasons, Bentley's senior side struggled in First Grade. Whilst they managed just 2 wins for the season, the A side players found themselves in winning positions on several occasions but failed on the line.

The team's batting was led by "ACE" HAYWARD, LLOYD DUNGEY, PETER QUARTERMAINE and promising newcomer STEVE CARR but generally this aspect of the game was lacking in both depth and consistency. The bowling presented an even sorer picture. "ACE" HAYWARD was the chief wicket-taker with 17 victims, but only 2 others managed more than 10 wickets; they being PAUL HUTTON who played just 3 games before leaving due to employment change, and veteran GEORGE WOODHEAD who made a welcome return to the top side and did well in 4 appearances. PETER QUARTERMAINE proved to be a useful 'part-timer' throughout the season.

FOR THE RECORD

***THE RECORD partnership for the 5th wicket in the B side had stood at 65 since the 1962/63 season. Over the past 20 seasons many had threatened to rewrite this entry in the record book, but all had failed. But then came the 1983/84 season. In the 5th round of fixtures, playing Vic Park, STEVE CAIRNS and JOHN WILLIAMS broke the record with a partnership of 68. The ink had hardly dried in the record book when, in the following match against W.A.I.T., BILL HARMER and RON FERNANDEZ set a new mark of 73. Three games later and it happened again. This time PHIL ROBERTS and KEITH CHAPMAN pushed the mark to 75 in the game against Maccabi.

***HIGHEST and LOWEST! The C side's score of 252 against Melville represents the highest score compiled by our number 3 team whilst Teachers' meagre 30 against our B team is the lowest score that our number 2 side has dismissed a side for.

**DURING the season PHIL ROBERTS scored 515 runs. Whilst records have not been kept of total runs and wickets in each season, looking back through old 'end-of-season' issues I was unable to find a player in recent times who has exceeded 500 runs in a season.
 Well done PHIL!

***JOHN WILLIAMS' haul of 9 wickets for 67 against Whitfords was the first time 9 wickets had been taken in an innings by a B Team bowler. The only other bowler to take 9 wickets in an innings is BILL SKUTHORPE who took 9-24 in our A Team in 1981/82.

***THE VETERANS of the club certainly showed the way in the bowling department this season! The leading wicket-takers for the season were TONY MALINS (48), GEORGE WOODHEAD (43), GEOFF FARRALL (35) and JOHN WILLIAMS (28). The only others with more than 20 victims for the year were 'youngsters' RAY HARMER (30) and ANDREW HAYWARD (24).

MILESTONES: Very few bowling milestones were passed this season, despite some fine match performances by various bowlers. Geoff Farrall passed the 1100 wicket mark, while Keith Chapman and Dave Gittus each took their 50th wicket.

Next season should see George Woodhead become only the 3rd bowler to exceed the 400 wicket mark while John Hughes, Bill Skuthorp and (if he succumbs to his desires) Bill Harmer could exceed 100 wickets. Tony Malins would need to replicate his 1983/84 season if he aims to pass 600 wickets next season.
