BENTLEY WON BY 3 WICKETS ON THE 1st INNINGS

A PREMIERSHIP AFTER 12 YEARS

Words can hardly do justice when one tries to describe Bentley's magnificent Grand Final victory over M.N.O.B. It was a game that had everything, top batting, great fielding and persistent bowling. But above all it was a game of incredible tension where 'the glorious uncertainty' that is cricket was shown at its best.

M.N.O.B. won the toss and batted on a strip full of runs, and one on which they had tasted victory just a week ago. With his very first delivery GREG NAIRN dismissed Osbourne, M.N.O.B.'s Semi Final batting hero. It was over an hour before Bentley broke through again, once again through the agency of GREG NAIRN. The ensuing hour belonged totally to M.N.O.B. and at tea they were obviously well placed at 2-100. Following the interval JOHN WILLIAMS struck a purple patch to snare 3 for 4 in the space of 20 balls. The first to a splendid catch by PETER TAYLOR, the second to a fine capture by LLOYD DUNGEY at deep mid-wicket and the third to a slashed edge to 'keeper BRIAN HAYWARD. Suddenly M.N.O.B. were 5-117 and on the defensive. They were kept in this mode for the remainder of the day as the Bentley bowlers maintained a fine line and length attack. Shortly before the close IAN DICKERSON struck giving LLOYD his 3rd catch and setting the overnight score at 6-161.

The following morning saw ACE HAYWARD and GREG NAIRN resume the attack. As the 20 overs progressed the M.N.O.B. batsmen gained in confidence and a big score appeared imminent. ACE claimed the day's first wicket with a case of 'six and out' to make it 7-202, GREG took his 3rd and it was 8-218 but the next wicket did not fall until the final over of the innings. In the interim GREG saw his figures swell from 3-46 off 29 overs (a magnificent exhibition of accurate bowling) to 3-61 Off 30 overs. With 2 balls to spare ACE made it 9-249, then a scrambled bye brought up the 250 - a reasonable score at the best of times, but a formidable target in a Grand Final.

Bentley began disastrously with the loss of PHIL ROBERTS in the 3rd over and when STEVE COX sparred outside the off once too often the Blues were in trouble at 2-13. A solid partnership then ensued between the reliable BRIAN HAYWARD and player of the semi-final, PETER QUARTERMAINE. The dismissal of BRIAN to a bottom edge for 26 ended a 55 run partnership and started a dramatic slump. PETER TAYLOR followed almost immediately, ACE HAYWARD battled to find touch before falling l.b.w. just 4 balls after PETER QUARTERMAINE had given spinner Medley a wicket with his first ball. PETER had batted with grit and determination to make 44, but at 6-83 many felt Bentley's quest was over. LLOYD DUNGEY and MATT KNOWLES had other ideas! LLOYD batted as only LLOYD knows how, sitting on the bowler, waiting for the loose ball, urging his partner all the time and (in his own words) 'bleeding the runs'. MATT survived an anxious beginning, edging several deliveries through a slip area what was inexplicably patrolled by just one fieldsman. He then began to grow in confidence and set about scoring his first 50 for Bentley and his highest score ever in cricket. The atmosphere was electric. The partisan Bentley supporters hadn't given up all hope, but they certainly were silent. However, as the partnership began to bloom the crowd blossomed too. The 100 hardly rated a clap, the 150 saw the target closer and the crowd began to warm, MATT's half century was greeted enthusiastically, the century partnership had the supporters in raptures, the 200 mark and the vocal crowd knew victory was in sight and they cheered every run. It was M.N.O.B.'s turn to cheer when the new ball saw MATT dismissed for a magnificent 79 and the score 7-231. LLOYD was joined by the baby of the side IAN DICKERSON and run-by-run that elusive pennant came closer to Bentley's grasp. It was fitting that the winning run should come from the bat of LLOYD, the veteran of 229 games for Bentley and a player who epitomises the calm, confident approach that captain-coach PETER TAYLOR has instilled into the team this season.

The victory vindicated the committee's decision to appoint PETER TAYLOR as coach and is a tribute to PETER's leadership. He has consistently shown his faith in his charges and the players have responded splendidly to his faith. There are 2 fine examples of the effect that PETER has had. One has been the approach to batting. Players who previously had quite ordinary batting averages have achieved a consistency of performance well beyond previous performances. The other is in the bowling department. Many have been dubious of the practice of playing with just 4 frontline bowlers. PETER has shown great faith in these bowlers and they did not let him down. We salute you PETER

and your splendid team.

NUMBER 1 SIDE

Bentley's number 1 side achieved the ultimate goal that all sides set their sights upon at the commencement of each season - a Premiership! In all, just 18 players represented the Blues' top side. The batting had great depth with ACE HAYWARD (51.71), LLOYD DUNGEY (48.25), GARY HARBORD (44.0), STEVE COX (32.25) and PETER TAYLOR (26.9) all averaging over 25 in the qualifying games. The bowling was virtually carried on the broad shoulders of 4 players with JOHN WILLIAMS taking 24 wickets at an average of 17.37, IAN DICKERSON 27 at 18.03, ACE HAYWARD 31 at 19.00 and GREG NAIRN 25 at 20.8 in the qualifying games. The fielding was of a high quality with 'keeper BRIAN HAYWARD, skipper PETER TAYLOR and ACE HAYWARD leading the way.

NUMBER 2 SIDE

Bentley's number 2 side was expected to perform strongly in 4th Grade, but inconsistency and instability (27 players represented this side with only 2 playing in all 11 games). Despite winning 3 matches and drawing 1, the side finished 2nd bottom. Newcomers STEVE COX and MATT KNOWLES were the mainstays of the batting before deservedly gaining promotion. PHIL KENRICK made a fine return to cricket, MAL DICKERSON made a number of good scores and TONY MALINS continued his improvement with the bat. The bowling lacked depth though GREG DICKERSON and TONY MALINS returned some good figures. TONY FISK had his moments but the slower bowlers were generally disappointing. In the fielding department DORIAN LEDDEN had an excellent season behind the stumps whilst energetic youngsters in CHRIS LOCKYER and MAL DICKERSON stood out. Both KIM FOWLER and CHRIS HANSEN showed good all-round talent in limited appearances.
