This is particularly noticeable in the bowling department where the top 2 wicket takers in 1st Grade, the leading wicket taker in 5th Grade and also in 7th Grade, are all well over 40.

To continue to progress as a Club we need to continue to infuse new young blood into our teams. Now is the time to start looking for players to do this.

Thanks to everyone who helped make 86/87 a memorable season for me personally, and I look forward to continuing our association next season.

NUMBER 1 SIDE

As has been the case in the past, Bentley found the transition from 2nd to 1st Grade beyond them and, with just 1 win, finished bottom. Generally the batting lacked substance with only 4 players scoring half centuries. ANDREW HAYWARD stood out in this department after experiencing a slow start (in his last 8 visits to the crease he amassed 304 runs at an average of 60.8 and was only dismissed 4 times by the bowlers). PETER TAYLOR actually had a higher average than his 85/86 figure and he showed that 1st Grade isn't that much tougher, BRIAN HAYWARD was consistent (reaching double figures 10 times) but he never really went on to build a big score, PETER QUARTERMAINE was the second highest run scorer but this was due to 3 innings (52, 44, 65) and, by his standards, he had a poor season. If the batting was thin, then the bowling was transparent! Last season the quartet of ANDREW HAYWARD, GREG NAIRN, IAN DICKERSON and JOHN WILLIAMS took a total of 125 wickets. This season their combined tally was just 39. JOHN was the most successful of the 4 with 15 wickets including a 5-34. The chief wicket-taker was veteran TONY MALINS who regularly made early in-roads into the opposing side's batting. His figures were marred by maulings at the hands of WAIT and Nollamarra (95 runs conceded in 16 wicketless overs). The fielding was sound, led by PETER TAYLOR (who took some spectacular catches), LLOYD DUNGEY and BRIAN HAYWARD.

NUMBER 3 SIDE

Despite registering 3 wins (including 1 outright), Bentley appears to finished 2nd last in 7th Grade this season and may well find themselves in 8th Grade next season. This represents a huge slump over recent years as it was only in the 81/82 season that Bentley's number 3 side was in 5th Grade. The reasons are quite obvious. We simply have not been able to give our "C" team the stability required for success, this is evident by the fact that 26 players represented our 7th Grade side during the season, and the loss of key players in the upper grades (Steve Cox, Steve Carr, Chris Hansen and Tony Fisk spring to mind) result in a drain on our "C" team's strength. Veteran STEVE CAIRNS stood out head and shoulders in the batting department whilst youngsters DOM CHEMIAL and MATT HARMER showed great potential. The young legs of this pair saw them dominate the field--ing votes with STEVE KING doing extremely well from limited appearances. In the bowling, evergreen GEOFF FARRALL continued to lead the way while PETER ROACH jnr gave good support. RAY BAND returned some excellent fig--ures (including 7-53) while CHRIS LOCKYER and KEN HARMER (the latter taking a hat trick) performed creditably in limited appearances.
