Analyzing a completed season is always difficult and on this particularly occasion even more so, especially as the season finished with two extremely disappointing Grand Final losses.

Putting that aside we reflect on the season and the Club overall and find that the 1<sup>st</sup> Team performed remarkably well to finish on percentage outside of the four, our highest finish in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade since 1976. I have no doubts, if it were not for one or two inconsistent games mid-year then this team would have also played a major role in the finals.

Our season highlight was surely our 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> teams reaching the grand final, the manner in which these teams performed throughout the year at the highest level of their collective abilities was outstanding, fitting reward also as I believe these sides more often than not set the benchmark at training. ## 1st Grade Report

When the season started way back in August, who could have predicted some of the things that have eventuated in the past 6 months. Firstly a few big name recruits who signed, but never actually managed to don the baggy blue, and according to Big Al he was in talks with the world's best off-spinner on a flight to Melbourne!

Never the less our season started against everyone's favourite club Whitfords at Macdonald Park. The third game of the year marked the return of our English import Ian Pattison and this time he brought another, Stu Walker. Teams was unavailable this game and Simon had gone back to Skipper the seconds. We travelled to Ocean Ridge through 3 border check points and finally made it there to find a very nice batting track. Ocean Ridge batted first and the team stuck to the game plan of tight bowling and some exceptional fielding especially by our super slip SOS. We managed to keep them to a reasonable total of 243 on a very good batting track.

With the new players coming in and others missing we had a new batting order and worked on partnerships to win the game with the first 2 partnerships being above 50 and being 1/100 with Steve Shearing continuing his good form. Stu Walker made his debut but didn't enjoy Aussie conditions straight up. After a few quick wickets we had Patto and Matt Rolfe batting at tea and only 4 wickets down. A quick wicket saw Chuck join Patto and the pair had a 140 run partnership with Patto making 100 off 91 deliveries and ending up on 114, Chuck was not out 40 with Matt Harmer and we won by 5 wickets. - Al Tyler -

Round 4 and I had the boys back due to the game being washed out week one. The ensuing one-dayer had a little bit of everything. Early wickets, then a couple of partnerships got away from us and Subl-Marist set us a difficult total of 203 for victory. Losing an early wicket due to a run-out sort of put a shiver through the side and only some late order stroke play from Big Al saw us get to the total of 163.

Wembley. Memories of last year's game still etched in our brains, and noses and nuts for some of us, the boys were keen to make amends. On a damp wicket we were fortunate the Queen Mother's head faced the sky and we had no hesitation in saying we'll have a bowl thanks. Both new ball bowlers bowled extremely well, Jamie Hendry with good pace once his confidence grew and we rolled Wembley for 106. We had an hour to bat that night we were well placed at 4/60 overnight. The following week saw some unlikely hero's with the bat in Matty Harmer and Steven Paice. As valuable as 100's, "5-fors" etc are the "20's" these two guys made, they were probably more valuable in securing 6 points on this occasion in the conditions.

1<sup>st</sup> game after Xmas was High Wycombe which turned out to be a cricketing lesson for us with senior A grade cricketers such as Justin Seal, Warren Hughes and Alan MacDougall showing us how cricket is played at this level. A disappointing loss.

Swan Valley was another result similar to Wembley last year. Oh so close to a win and then resulting in an outright loss. One I think we'd all rather forget.

Due to the results after Xmas, there was a lot of "bar talk" about the A grade and a meeting of all A grade squad members, committee and coaching staff before the Doubleview game. It was very constructive and we left for Doubleview confident of a big win, and that it was!! After only setting DV a total of 144, the boys came out fired up and we had the game by the balls by the end of play with DV 6 down. The innings was wrapped up early the next day and then some valuable 2<sup>nd</sup> Innings batting practise was had by Steve and myself.

Bassendean was the side we beat last year to avoid relegation however unfortunately we couldn't repeat it this year. The big positive was the 2<sup>nd</sup> week where we set a plan and stuck to it chasing an outright, we fell just short. Highlight was the return to form of Patto with a display of destructive hitting.

Bedford-Morley are the cellar dwellers this year, however we needed a win to guarantee playing A grade cricket again next year.....the boys delivered in the best possible fashion! Highlights of our 100 run win was Patto's 86 which was deserved of another 14, and the joy he showed in hitting the winning runs. Omo's mature Innings of 57 which ensured victory and the debut of Michael Knight in which he took 4 very valuable wickets.

With next year safe we faced Balcatta in the final fixture. Oddly enough finals were now on the agenda. We lost the toss and were sent in on another "interesting" wicket. After losing wickets steadily, only one batsman gutsed through the day. Laurance Paice carried his bat for 49no. The following week started with Balcatta at 3/40 chasing our 140. After a steady start, the game was interrupted by an "interesting" spectator. The 15min break in play helped us and with Matt Rolfe cleaning up the tail we took 5/8 to win by 7 runs. An outright win would have seen us playing finals, therefore we had a crack but with no luck.

Special thanks must go to the Committee and Coaches for their support as well as the other captains. Thanks to Big Al and Patto in their roles as v/c's during the year. It was a successful year for this side despite a few hiccups with the development of younger players such as Laurance Paice, Omo and Michael Knight. If we can stay together next year, the side that has developed together enormously in the past month, we will play finals cricket.

## 3rd Grade Report

The Bentley 3<sup>rd</sup> grade had a great 2004/05 season and were only an afternoon of good betting short of a premiership. To get to this position was a huge effort by many people. There were only 3 losses in the regular season which ensured a 3<sup>rd</sup> position on the ladder finish. Making the finals was a pre-season goal for this side and to achieve it was an accomplishment that hasn't been done for a long while in this grade.

Glenn Davies was the stand-in skipper at the start of the season and continued on with his illustrious captaincy record at Bentley with 2 wins against traditionally strong clubs in Whitfords and Applecross. Russell Budd, Dean Scott, Stewart Jefferys and Jamie Hendry all featured prominently in these early wins.

Next to suffer a loss to Bentley was Ocean Ridge beaten by over 100 runs. Stewart Jefferys provided the backbone for a big score and Jamie George and Tony Magill bowled the side to victory. The Subi-Marist game was memorable even though it was our first loss. Chasing 193 Bentley were in a commanding position after a 117 run stand between Mark Petta and Simon Magill before a collapse of 6/34 left us 15 runs short. Mark played an outstanding knock of 69 not out.

The next game against Wembley Districts will rank along side the all-time great matches. Due to a washout the previous week 3<sup>rd</sup> grade played a 1-day match for their first game on the turf pitch at Wyong. Wembley posted a competitive score of 183 from their allotted 40 overs. The run chase was steady but regular losses of wickets meant that we were always well behind on the run rate. Omid Fanayan anchored the innings well with good support from Chris Prescott however it was the fireworks of Tony Magill and Damien Hewitt that sealed a memorable victory. With only 7 overs remaining we still needed 77 runs, even the die hard Bentley optimists held little hope. At the fall of the 7<sup>th</sup> wicket Tony came to the crease with 9 balls remaining and 26 runs still required. His first ball faced was put over the fence, a few of the bar regulars sensed something special was about to happen and made their way outside. The next two deliveries were also 6's followed by a 2. In the last over Damien fulfilled a childhood fantasy by hitting a 6 on the last ball to win the game.

Another narrow loss followed in the game against High Wycombe once again Bentley were cruising in their chase of 226 but a late collapse of 6/30 meant we were short by 8 runs. Both of the Fanayan brothers contributed well in this game. We rebounded strongly against Swan Valley largely due to the bowling of Matt Rolfe and Danny Arcaro. Jamie Hendry took the bowling honours in a disciplined display from all of the Bentley attack.

Doubleview were swept aside by a clinical Bentley bowling effort for 95. Fab Fanayan proved the difference with a commanding knock of 80. Bassendean were the next to be thrashed in a similar manner. Stewart Jefferys returned from injury to boost the side to another 100 run victory.

Stuart Walker initiated a big score of 265 for Bentley against Bedford Morley. This was unfortunately not enough as the bowlers could not penetrate and another narrow loss resulted on the last ball of the day. The final regular season match against Balacatta was another 1-day game. Aggressive batting from Joe Porter enabled us to post a reasonable total of 157. It was tight bowling from Danny Arcaro and Al Tyler that gave the opposition no chance of reaching our score.

With a lot of movement between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sides throughout the season come finals time we had a surplus of players qualified to play in finals. Picking the side on recent form meant that we had a very strong side. The semi-final game against the competition's bad boys Whitfords on their home ground was probably our most complete game. They lived up to their reputation and threw everything at us. The batsman withstood the onslaught and made 281 with everyone contributing and Omid Fanayan being the stand out with 85. The bowling again was a team effort and enabled us to beat them by over 100 runs.

The grand final against Wembley was a show down between the heavyweights of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. The much revered betting of Wembley was kept in check by Bentley and although they averaged nearly 300 throughout the season we limited them to a fair total of 189. The bowlers again worked as a team and the wickets were spread around. The run chase never really got into gear and despite a few pockets of resistance Bentley were removed late in the day for a disappointing 118.

Individually the highlight of the season's batting was the consistency of Stewart Jefferys at the top of the order. Apart from a dodgy first ball LBW decision his lowest score for the season was 28 (from 7 innings). Tragically he suffered a broken wrist mid season. In a testament to his character he remained in the side as 12<sup>th</sup> man and still contributed to this team setting new standards in the role. Veteran's Mark Petta and Danny Arcaro also provided good stability in the middle order at various times throughout the season. The Fanayans (Omid and Fab) and the Paices (Laurence and Steve) were also instrumental in the side regularly making large scores of 200 or more.

There was never a stand out bowler in the side but always strong attacks that were unrelenting. Matt Harmer, Tony Magill, Danny Arcaro and Al Tyler were more than handy all-rounders performing well with bat and ball. Add to this the likes of Chris Prescott, Jamie Hendry, Dean Scott and Damien Hewitt and the depth of bowling was always very strong often resulting in wickets being shared around.

Fielding was another area the side performed well in. Omid Fanayan was all class displaying some of the finest catching and throwing seen at Bentley. His brother Fab, Laurence Paice, Al Tyler and Joe Porter were just some of the others that provided highlights in the field. Some 12 opposition run-outs was evidence of this high skill level.

Another role that this side performs is to develop players for the next level. It is pleasing to note that the next generation of Bentley champions all performed well in this grade. ## 7th Grade Report

A very disappointing season that never really took off at any time and was handicapped by our inability to embrace the one day format.

This team won 7 of 14 games, although this only included 3 of 8 one day games. Our performances in the 2 day format were strong, but in the end, our inability to win one day games cost us a place in the finals. This is highlighted by the fact that the two sides who met in the grand final (Balcatta and Doubleview Carine) were both soundly defeated by us in two day games during the season.

Three things stand out for me from the season just passed:

This team lacked a core of players around which the season could be built. In all, this side had 39 players participate in 7<sup>th</sup> grade games this season, with only one person (yours truly) playing in all 14 games. Two others played 10 games each, with the average games per player being only 4. Although not impacting on the competitiveness of the team throughout the season, this lack of continuity of core players certainly impacted on our ability to win at crucial times throughout the season. My message to the Club hierarchy and selectors for the next season is that we must establish a core group of 6 or 7 players who are going to play in this team for the entire season. Only then will we win the premiership that we dearly covet so much.

Our batting skills were again shown to be deficient, with us only passing 200 twice and only two players aggregating more than 200 runs for the season. This indicates that batsmen do not place a high enough value on their wicket, and are content to continue to play unwarranted shots that gets them out. Unfortunately, undisciplined batting in the nets at training was often indicative of the approach taken in matches. Batsmen should follow the lead of Chuck Berry who places a high price on his wicket at both training and in matches – his efforts in 5 innings this year are testament to this.

We did unearth some new young talent who, hopefully, will be a part of the Bentley scene for a number of years to come. I refer specifically to Liam Bradburn, Daniel Brand, Tristin Mead, Wade McKay, Doug Haines and Ed Daquino. Joshua Naim matured as a bowler of some ability and Shane George demonstrated that he has the ability to be a major part of this team in the future.

Notwithstanding the above negative sentiments, the season was an enjoyable one and one that the Club as a whole can learn from. My thanks to all 39 players who participated this year, with special thanks to Brian Hayward and Graeme Verco who helped us out at times that we were short. My thanks also to the wives, girlfriends and various spectators during the year who helped us with afternoon teas and generally supported us when possible.

In closing, the season was not a successful one and we can do better. I will be back next season with continuing aspirations of captaining this side and look forward to seeing you all back to finally win the premiership that we aspire to win.
