POINTS OF INTEREST FROM THE RECORDS

***NO FROM than 17 players have scored 50 in an innings and taken 5 wickets in an innings. Unfortunately my records don't reveal if this has been achieved in the one game. It may come as a surprise to some to find that BRIAN HAYMARD and KEITH CHAPMAN (not generally recognised as bowlers) are two of the 17.

***CERTAIN NAMES crop up in the records revealing how the Club has been a family affair over the years. FARRALLS(4), CLARKES(3), SARRES(3), RITCHIES(2), STREETS(2), DUNGEYS(2), HAY TARDS(2), TROUCHETS(2), TOBINS(2) SPENCERS(2). No doubt KEN will join his brother BILL HARMER in the future but what are the odds of a third generation RITCHIE playing for Bentley?
