EDITORIAL

This special edition of the "Bentley Cricketer" contains a brief summary of the 1971/72 season, a comprehensive coverage of the Club's records since 1953/53 and a critical look at our prospects for the coming season.

As usual, I don't mind if I tread on a few toes in this or any future editions, and I would more than appreciate printing any views or criticisms that any member of this Club may have to offer.

I found the old score books made very interesting reading and I hope that you find the records I have extracted from them just as interesting. I must emphasise that these records only go back to 1953, thus the figures applied to Roy Ritchie and others who played before that year are incomplete.

1971/72 FIRST GRADE

This was a disasterous year for this side which finished a dismal last. The weakness was easy to find; BATTING; In this competition a score of at least 150 is required to have a chance of winning. This averages out at about 15 runs per man. However, when one considers that only 3 players averaged over 15 for the season it is easy to see where we fell down. Consider also that two of these three players only played in a total of 7 matches between them! The one batsman to perform with any semblance of consistently good form was Adrian Ball. with an average of 21.7. At the beginning of the season, it appeared that the bowling would be the big problem but this was not the case. Although Tony Malins was well below his best form for most of the season, Stu Rankin and George Woodhead proved more than a problem to many opposing batsmen.

FOURTH GRADE

The Fouth Grade's performances during the season were in direct contrast to the inept efforts of the First Grade. It was possibly only lack of experience on turf that prevented this side winning the Grand Final. Many players gave outstanding performances at some stage of the season and it was this non-reliance on any individual that was the main strength of this combination. They had a wealth of bowling talent and also had batsmen down the list who were capable of rescuing a situation, as they did on many occasions.

# 1972/73 Prospects

With several of last season's players unavailable this year, we barely have the makings of two teams. Only 23 appear to be likely to continue playing this season. Undoubtedly the two hardest to replace will be Keith Chapman and Peter Bradbrook. However, the other players (Ralph Dungey, Phil Wilson, Bill Dartnell, John Towers, Graham Laerenos, Garry Bonser, Warwick Obles, Jim Whyte and Rob Kidd) played in a total of 28 games between them and thus were important, at various stages of the year, in our endeavours to have full sides at all games. 23 players means that no more than one player can be unavailable at one time. Unfortunately, some of these 23 have already indicated that they may miss games during the season. Looking on the brighter side of things, we always seem to manage a couple of new players each year. Let us look at the players we have now.

BALL Adrian - A reliable opening bat and useful wicket keeper who joined the Club last year. Adrian proved to be the backbone of the First Grade batting last season but he will need support if we are to improve in Second Grade this season.

Dert Creg - Captain of the First Grade last season, Greg did not have a very good season with the bat. He made several promising starts to inningses but did not build a major soore. Better things are hoped from Greg this season.

DUNGEY Lloyd - A classic batsman on his day, and a useful slow bowler who has been used only speringly in recent seasons. Lloyd had possibly his worst season last year but only has to re-capture previous form to be a great asset in Second Grade this season.

EHLERS Ray - In his first season last year, Ray proved to be a useful bat and an excellent fieldsman in Fourth Grade. At training this season he has improved beyond recognition. He could also develop into a useful spin bowler if given the chance. I predict a very good season in Third Grade for Ray.

FARRALL Geoff - In the twilight of his career, Cooff now only plays in the lower team though I believe he would still be a success if he played in Second Grade this season. Geoff has scored more runs and taken more wickets than any player in the history of Bentley. His skill as a slow bowler and his batting ability will once again be invaluable this season.

FARRALL Michael - A youngster who shows a great deal of potential as a slow bowler. Michael also shows sound technique and good temprament as a batsman. With experience he should develop into a very useful player in third grade this season.

FAPPALL Peter - Potentially the best all-rounder in the Club with the possible exception of Stu Rankin. Last season was not one of Peter's better years but I believe he will re-capture his form this season. Peter is an aggressive, hard-hitting bat, a useful medium -fast bowler, a potential match-winner as a spinner and the best slips fielder in the Club.

FARRALL Stephen - Due to injury, Steve missed many games last sea-son. He is a good new-ball bowler in the lower grade who could develop into a bowler of the future. Stephen is also strong but somewhat unreliable bat. Should have a successful season in Third Grade.

GUERDS Mike - Missed the majority of the season due to an interstate trip last season. Mike is a hard hitting batsman and a more than useful medium pace bowler. He should do well in Third Grade and I'm tipping him to play second Grade if any batsmen fail in that side.

HARMER William - Bill is a punishing batsman, useful medium-fast bowler and brilliant close to the wicket fieldsman who made a very successful comeback after an absence of 3 seasons. Bill has the ability to succeed in either Grade this season.

HAYWOOD Brian - In his first season with Bentley, Brian proved to be an all-rounder of great promise. Although he played the majority of games in Fourth Grade last season, I feel his batting ability and his medium-fast bowling would make him a success in Second Grade this season.

KENRICK Phil - A courageous and consistent opening batsman, Phil looks the logical choice to open the innings for Second Grade with

Adrian Ball. Phil has flaws in his technique but more than makes up for them with his fighting temprament.

LITTLE Ken - "Harold" is, at times under-rated as an all-rounder. His deceptive and economical swing bowling has earnt him many wickets over the seasons and when in the right frame of mind he can be a dour batsman. Unfortunately his urge to "have a bash" rarely meets with consistent success. Capable of holding a place in Second Grade this season.

MALINS Tony - Although heading the First Grade wicket takers last season, his was a disappointing season. "C.A." is a shade above medium-fast and although he appears to lose a yard of pace each season he is the logical new-ball bowler for Second Grade this season. His batting ability is somewhat limited.

MOULTON Len - Len, the captain of last season's highly successful Fourth Grade side, is a grafter of runs. Although he rarely makes a major score, he consistently contributes for his side. With the absence of Peter Bradbrook, he is likely to open for the Third Grade.

RANKIN Stu - A brilliant but unpredictable all-rounder. Although essentially a batsman (and one of class at that) he performed exceptionally well as a swing-bowler in First Grade last season. At this stage he appears likely to share the new ball with Tony Malins in Second Grade although he prefers to be first change.

RITCHIE Ken - The Fourth Grade wicket keeper last season. Ken is a very hard striker of the ball and has some very good scores to his name. He is likely to 'keep in Third Grade again this season but he could possibly gain promotion on the strength of his batting.

RITCHIE Roy - Roy has been with the Club longer than any other player. Last season in Fourth Grade he did extremely well with his cunning slow bowling early in the season. SAXBY Warren - Warren shows potential as a batsman and he is a reliable fieldsmanHe should find himself representing the Club in Third Grade far more frequently than in past seasons.

STREET Ron - Possibly the most consistent all-rounder in Fourth Grade last season. Ron is a useful and economical medium pacer and a consistent run scorer. He should have another good season in Third Grade with definite prospects of promotion to Second Grade.

TAYLOR Terry - A "veteran" of the Club who will play his 100th game this season. Terry is a useful all-rounder whose medium pace bowling and dour batting have frequently met with success. Terry is a student of the game and I'm tipping him to lead the Third Grade side although his services may be reqired in Second Grade.

THOMPSON Lance - Another player in line for his 100th game. Lance is a versatile cricketer. He is a powerful batsman, efficient wicket keeper and useful medium pacer. He will probably 'keep for the Second Grade side who will be hoping he has his eye in with the bat.

WOODHEAD George - George surprised many with his greatly improved slow bowling in First Grade last season. The Second Grade side this season will be looking to a continuation of this form this season. George, who will develop further with experience, could prove to be a match winner in the future. His batting ability is restricted.

Well, these are the materials we have to mould into our Second and Third Grade sides. The experience is there, the ability is there. Let's hope that the dedication will also be there. The Second Grade should find things easier this season and with greater application could have a successful season. The Third Grade will find the going tougher after their promotion but if they continue with the same team spirit and will—to—win then they should succeed. In conclusion, all I can say is good luck to all players; take each game as it comes; never stop trying and let's see if we can make 1972/73 a vintage season.
