I believe this can be achieved as long as these sides are afforded a degree of stability - particularly in the captaincy department. Perhaps the answer lies in the exemption of captains from promotion.

Now onto the Club's activities off the field. Last season the Club involved itself in a variety of social events which, unfortunately, were poorly attended and financially a failure. This season, the comm--itter wisely pruned the number of organised functions and concentrated on catting Bentley on an even keel financially. The highly successful gambling night achieved this purpose. Whilst there were a few grumbles over the lack of purely social events, the majority of members showed by their absence that such events are not always practical. This asp--ect of the Club's activities will have to be closely examined by the

incoming committee next season.

In conclusion, may I thank all those connected with the publication of the "Cricketer" this season; in particular CLIVE PEYNOLDS for pro--viding the means of upgrading the quality of the final product, and BRIAN WAYWARD for his efforts in keeping the newsletter going in my absence.

BITS & PIECES

***FOURTEEN members made their debut with the club this season. Of these, 3 (STEVE MILLS, DAMIAN KNOWLES and KEN BOYES) earned selection in the top side. Last season, 16 players joined the club and 3 made the top team. It is puzzling that, with 30 new members in 2 seasons, we had difficulty in filling our number 3 side at times.

***BILL HARMER established a unique record when he became the first Bentley player to score a half century in all 3 sides in one season. BILL certainly had a fine season with the bat, scoring a total of 501 runs at an average of 33.4 Only LLOYD DUNGEY with 517 runs at an average 36.9 was able to better this performance. It is by no co--incidence that it was this pair that established a club record open--ing stand of 198 and between them featured in 9 stands in excess of

***SLOWLY but surely GEORGE WOODHEAD draws closer to scoring his 500 th run for the club. After 12 seasons and 131 games, next season could see GEORGE successful. Of course, if he hadn't run out of partners so often (a club record of 49 times not out) GEORGE would be shooting for double his present target!

***GEOFF FARRALL's tally of 36 wickets for the season suggests that he will have little trouble in reaching the "impossible" figure of 1000 wickets for Bentley. I guarantee that the victim that gives him that remarkable figure will wonder what all the commotion is over.

***AN INDICATION of the improvement of batting standards within the club is that 9 of the 20 record partnerships in the top two sides were set in the past 3 seasons. Cynics might suggest that pitches favour batsmen more than they used to.

***WHILST on record partnerships, have you noticed how certain names keep cropping up? KEN ESMOND, KEITH CHAPMAN and BILL HARMER each feature in 4 records whilst BRIAN HAYWARD figures in 3. LLOYD DUNGEY has been in no fewer than 7 century stands, yet only one of these is a record.

***UNFORTUNATELY my records have not included hat tricks, thus denying RAY HARMER a well deserved mention. I hope to remedy this situation by including records of this feat in future issues (when I have the opportunity to go through the score books again)

***DURING the past 7 seasons, our number 1 side has lost only 2 games outright. During this period, they have registered 13 outright wins. Considering that 4 of these 7 seasons have been in 1st Grade, this gives ample evidence of Bentley's ability to perform creditably at the top level of competition. The number 2 side have won outright 14 times in the past 5 years. In this time they have lost outright 7
