Coaching Staff Reports

"No team or club has a God-given right to win Premierships" were the words I said in my first address to the Club as Coach back in September last year. It was a fairly flat and obvious statement – especially to a club that remained agonisingly elusive to a Premiership for over fifty years. However after the 07/08 season's performance in which our A-grade side made the 'Top-4' for the first time since 1976 and in a year where we had sat on top of the ladder for the majority of the summer before finishing second only by percentage and eventually stalling in the semi-final courtesy of just a forty-minute, below-par session, expectations of going the extra step in 2008/9 were rife leading into this new campaign. But for myself and Captain Darren Solomon, it was vital that the Club and team didn't start expecting that this extra step would be merely a natural progression. Hard work in the correct areas for improvement and a belief in our own ability built by doing the basics right and creating consistency and stability were the key for this 08/09 season.

The year didn't actually start all that well for us. Beaten by newly-promoted Bedford Morley in the first game – albeit on the last ball of the match and with them being 9 wickets down! However, two positives came from this defeat: 1) it was an early wake-up call that we would have to work harder this year, and 2) it got our first loss out of the way early and therefore removed that 'fear of failure' that had perhaps plagued us at the more crucial stage of the season before.

From there we started playing some very good cricket. We demolished 07/08 Premiers Wembley, bowling them out for 105. We were equally as impressive against Balcatta – this time with the bat – scoring over 300, which was particularly pleasing as we were at Wyong, a difficult place to score runs, and playing against one of the best leg-spinners in the league. We posted solid 200+ scores against Subiaco Marist and Western Suburbs, and we were clinical against Whitfords – dismissing them for 120 and going well past them the next week.

The most pleasing things from a coach's point of view by the mid-season Christmas break were 1) we had not yet been bowled out in any game, which showed improved stability in our batting; 2) two new guys now had A-grade centuries to their names – Laurence Paice, with an extremely dominant and high class 'opening batsman's' type of hundred against Balcatta, and Brendan Daye, with an unbelievably determined, gritty and under pressure hundred to win a match batting second against Whitfords. Other things that stood us in good stead were that we were starting to build more of a settled side with fewer personnel changes than there had been by the same stage of the previous season, and we had developed into probably the best fielding unit in the league.

A crushing outright victory over Fremantle straight after Christmas then cemented our status as one of the major forces in the league. Taking twenty wickets in a day, adding a third century-maker to the season's tally, and batting exactly as we'd said we wanted to in our team game plan – by building an innings with wickets in hand for the last 15 overs and then really taking the game away from the opposition – were the biggest positives for us.

We were brought back down to earth the next game with a poor batting performance against Doubleview-Carrine. However, the fact that we went for only just over 200 -bowling first against one of the best batting line-ups in the league on paper and on a fairly flat first-day wicket after they had got off to a flier - again showed the strength of our attack and that we had the ability to claw our way back when the momentum didn't start on our side.

If that performance was evidence then the next was complete proof. Bowling on a very good batting deck with a rapid outfield, conceding 140 for 2 by tea and staring at a likely 300+ target, our fight back was phenomenal. A blistering spell from Chris Prescott certainly helped our cause, but as a team and as a leadership group we mentally and tactically outclassed High Wycombe on the second part of that day, and with the return to form of Arden Wittensleger - after a first half season of frustrating dismissals and poor umpiring decisions - to inject some real power and dominance into our front-line batting and the potential to win us games off his own back, suddenly the belief came to us as a team and did so at the perfect point in the season.

A tie to Applecross after a slight wobble with our batting on day one kept us focussed on our off-field work and reiterated the importance of sticking to game plans. However, coming off from that game we all knew that we had a lot more left in the locker to give than Applecross did, which I think helped when we met them again later in the Grand Final.

A very solid, all-round performance against Swan Valley set us up perfectly to go into the Finals. Arden again showed his brilliance and Jack Duffy not only proved that he is a future player for the A-grade but one that could perform and strengthen our batting immediately which again boosted team confidence.

The way we then trained and worked leading up to the Semi Final and the belief we instilled in each other is perhaps the most satisfying part of the season for me as coach. Drawn against Doubleview-Carrine, the team many would have had down as the favourite for the Premiership and the team that had run through us on the second day of our earlier fixture with them, we came up with plans to combat their most potent of batting and bowling threats, practiced in a variety of ways to execute these, and then in short went out and did it! Without

doubt we were the better-drilled side over those two days and it wasn't by good fortune that our plans came off, the half-chances went to hand, the bowling was spot on, and the chase-down barely gave them a sniff. That victory gave us all the confidence we needed going into Grand Final week where we would come up against Applecross, a team who's wheels had just started to come loose as the season drew to a close.

I don't think the Grand Final really needs much reporting on. Everyone by now knows what happened. We played very good cricket for 90% of the two days, with our only wobble being a flurry of wickets shortly before tea on day 1. Fab Fanayan's, Omo Fanayan's, and Chris Prescott's innings are all worth mentioning though – all three of them were match winning, were scored by guys that had so far had relatively quiet seasons with the bat but had all kept working and working for when their time would come. Their belief in their own games was strong and they each stuck rigidly to a game plan. A coach could not ask for more from any player.

Similarly, a coach cannot ask for any more from the captain – Darren Solomon – who's leadership, organisational and motivational performance this season has been absolutely outstanding and has played a massive part in driving us to this A-grade Premiership. Add to this all the support staff we've had with us this year – Darty, Verco, Old Sol, Gards – as well as the backing from the committee and other club members, and it is no wonder why we are seen as, and I quote, the best supported club in the league.

I said earlier that no club or team has a God-given right to win Premierships and this is certainly still the case. But Bentley's now won one!

However hard it is to reach the top it is twice as hard to stay there and we must not become complacent and expect success automatically.

This year it has been a privilege to be involved with such a great bunch of blokes and also a magnificent cricket club.

Day One

Sol's lucky coin worked and we batted first on a flat track, with a slightly long and slower outfield that would make batsmen earn a few runs. We got away disastrously, with Hoover edging behind for a duck and Dayesy not keeping a hook shot down and holing out in the deep for three.

Arden and Covers came together and Arden played with his natural flair, ably supported by the dependable playing coach, Covers, who played a steady hand and put the odd bad ball away to take the score to a steady 2/70, before Arden fell to a blinder at cover for 30 and Jack Duffy followed soon after for five. Covers and Hoff appeared to be going steadily along until disaster struck soon after when Covers fended a shortish lifter to second slip and was caught low down for 34. Hoff then nicked left armer Alan Weir to the keeper for ten and Sol was out second ball lbw to A.Weir for a duck.

Both pushed singles and took on the field, rotating the strike regularly with their brilliant understanding. They also sweated on anything loose and dispatched it with precision, taking the score past the 130 mark and adding the first fifty partnership of the innings. It was 8/141 when Fab fell, but it wasn't over yet. Enter Chris Prescott, probably a little lean on runs this season, but saved his best for last with a patient, team orientated innings of 35 not out and a partnership of 40 plus with Omo, which pushed our score to a highly respectable and definitely defensible 180, which seemed impossible at 7/91. The left hand/right hand batting combination of Squid and Omo pushed and nudged singles and ran hard to create two's and three's on a slow outfield. Squid also loved the tiring bowlers putting them on his hip – quick runs to fine leg and backward square all day. Omo finally fell with the score at 9/181 and we were quite happy with that. He negotiated the first ball, but got a huge nick from the second ball and Arden took the chance gleefully at 2nd Slip 1/0. Rodden came in and saw out the rest of the over. Wicket maiden.

Schembri, the other left handed opener then had to negotiate Hiten, who was able to swing the ball and cut it off the seam just enough to trouble the left handers. He survived one ball and again, feathered a nick to Soly second ball – 2/0 – The Blue boys could smell blood!!! Petherick negotiated the rest of the over safely – Wicket maiden again!!!

Third Over - Rodden faces up to Squid Prescott steaming in from the Southern End with the breeze at his back and gets one on the hip, which he turns to fine leg and Hiten. Rodden runs hard for one and turns for two as Hiten picks up. He gets half way down the wicket, but is sent back by Petherick and the throw is relayed from Soly to Squid at the bowler's end and he runs Rodden out for one. 3/1. We cannot believe our luck – total disaster for Applecross.

Carrington Shepherd, the Applecross keeper joins Petherick and they safely see off a few overs, before Hiten is replaced by Lord Coverdale at the Pavilion End. He bowls steadily to keep the pressure on, until he gets Petherick with a swinging fuller ball and traps him on the crease – LBW for 20, 4/40.

Shepherd is going along steadily and making a handy fist of things until he is left stranded when skipper Mark Hullett edges to third slip and takes off for a run. Dayesy dives to his unnatural right hand side and brilliantly back hands it to Soly who runs out Shepherd for a well made 21. 5/51 and in strife, but we need to keep up the effort here – they won't lay down and just die.

Hullett and Tim McCormick worked hard and put together a handy partnership of 36 before Soly makes a great change and brings on the Hoff to bowl his straight medium pacers, which apply pressure and force the batsmen to play.

He has Hullett tied down and frustrated, until he goes after one that isn't there to hit and smashes it straight to Jack Duffy in the covers – out for 22. 6/87.

We can sniff it now, but still gotta keep going. Tea comes with McCormick having a bit of swing and Scott Curran grafting it out to 6/113. After tea, Soly goes with the opening pairing of Squid and Hiten again and Hiten finally

removes the stubborn Curran for 7 – 7 down for 113.

Scheffer joins McCormick, who is swinging at everything, including Dayesy, who went for a six over long on. The big breakthrough comes when Squid knocks over McCormick's off stump for a well made 36, almost there 8/120.

A.Weir comes in and tries to hold us up for a while – I think they had someone doing a rain dance as well. No way boys!!! Hiten off, Dayesy on again, he has them playing a missing or leaving everything – only a matter of time. A.Weir tries to swing Dayesy across the line and is plumb lbw for 6 – 9/122.

Enter B.Weir at No 11 – only a matter of time now. They survive Squid's over and take a few more off him and the score goes to 9/128 with one ball to go in the 64th over. Dayesy bowls to Scheffer on 8 – he tries to drive at him and nicks it. Soly gloves it and the finger goes up from the umpire. The Bentley Blues have won the flag!!! Applecross all out 128.

The players and supporters run from everywhere – hugs and delight all round. Gards runs from the scorers table – I had already added up and matched the totals up at 9 for, so I knew it totalled correctly. I wasn't gonna miss the celebrations of the club I've grown to love so much in one season. You beauty!!! A premiership in A grade – the top grade in the club – it's the ultimate prize!!!

I have to admit a little emotion in seeing the boys out there and how much it meant to them all. There were hugs all round and I'm sure a few lumps in the throat from others around the place. The stalwarts, Darty, Vercs, Soly snr, Lenny Woodley, Steve Shearing, Ace, PC, Cairnsy, Wingy, Covers and Soly and all the boys who played, the players from the other grades (congrats to all of you – 2 out of the four flags on offer for us that day), plus past players, partners, volunteers and supporters. It was a brilliant moment, that only got better when the whole club gathered around the wicket area and sang the team song as one and it was the first of many times in the next day or so. Oh how sweet!!! We all reserved a moment to shake the opposition's hands and show our respect. They fought hard, but the Blue Boys were just too goo and wanted it better.

Third Grade – Report

I fully expected this team to be playing finals at the end of the season as they had done the previous 4 seasons. With only 2 wins coming late in the season this side was never in contention for playing finals, finishing in 9th position. Although in two of the draws we were in commanding positions.

I was asked if I held on to the captaincy position for one season too long after so much previous success. The answer was a resounding “no”. Every team has their fluctuations.

The reason for the poor performance can be traced back to poor batting performance. There was only one occasion when over 200 runs were scored and batting out our allotted 72 overs was never achieved. My own poor form in the middle order contributed to the team’s batting slump, as well as a massive turn around in players meant that no stability or ‘batting confidence’ could be obtained.

Long term injuries to Paul Warren, Danny Arcaro, Evan Britton and Shaun O’Shea certainly affected the side. Add to this the unavailability at various times throughout the year of key players such as Ken Dawson, Tim D’Souza, Matt Harmer and the loss of 3rd grade stalwart Jos Welsh and you begin to see how the depth was tested.

One Day Side – Report

Our One Day side this year were runners up after being beaten by 9 runs in the grand final. This was a considerable improvement on our previous season when we finished second to last. Only 12 players qualified with seven or more games for the finals after we played 17 lead up matches. Tuart Hill was the only side we failed to win against and they were our opponents in the final. We finished the regular season in 3rd position after winning our last two games. Earlier we were top of the ladder after dropping only one game until just before Christmas. We lost 5 in a row over January and February and were in danger of missing the finals, however a more consistent team effort followed that period and our two finals matches were the only time for the season we had the same team two weeks in a row. Our final tally for the season was 11 wins and 8 losses.

This year 37 different players took the field for this team compared to 58 last season. The result was a stronger core group of players and thus the much improved year. Of those players 19 played 3 games or less. Juniors in Lleyton Taylor, Jacob Lockyer and Jay and Kieran Smith contributed well this season and further developed their cricketing skills against men. Stu Mills and Matt Ansley Rose played their first games of cricket ever and acquitted themselves well. Aman Gill was the player who showed the most individual improvement thru the season, particularly his bowling and fielding.

We were much stronger in bowling this year and dismissed the opposition 8 times with a further 5 occasions when the opposition was nine down. Last season we dismissed the opposition on only 3 occasions. In the previous season on only 2 occasions were 4 wickets taken by an individual in an innings. This season it happened 5 times with Serg Perrozzi completing the feat twice including the grand final. He had the best figures for the year (4 for 16 versus Balcatta). A reflection of the increased strength of our bowling this year was PC Smith's figures. Last season he was the leading wicket taker with 18 wickets in 55 overs. This year he was only required to bowl 24 overs. Steve Duncan (new to the club) was the leading wicket taker with 20, although Serg was not far behind with 19 and Mike Warren (out of retirement) 19 also.

We were dismissed on 4 occasions including 3 in a row in our losing stretch in January when we were sometimes short of players. Last year we had 5 century partnerships and 3 individual 100's. This season Serg Perrozzi and Lachie Harris got 105 for the 4th wicket against Balcatta in round 9 for the only one. Tony Magill, who travelled up from Collie to play scored 82 twice for the highest individual score of the year. 11 individual 50's were scored with Tony getting 4 of them. 4 players scored more than 300 runs for the season with Tony the best of them.

Chris Taylor again did very well in the fielding, winning the award whilst playing only 8 qualifying games. Our catching was generally good and the fielding energetic as a whole.

Tony Magill and Serg Perrozzi starred in the grand final with fine individual performances. Tony 2 for 6 off 7 overs and 42 not out and Serg 4 for 25 (including two fine stumpings by Adrian Nation) and 33 runs nearly got us over the line.

I would like to take this opportunity of congratulating the first grade on their historic win and Ken 's 7th grade for their fourth successive premiership season.

Thanks to Bentley CC for the opportunity of leading this side for the last three seasons and a big thank you to all the players who fronted with me every week and supported me fully through out our quests for victory. I would also extend my thanks to Sid Rao, Craig Strauss and P Man for their understanding in the lack of opportunities they experienced in the last few games when all available players were present.

AUTHORS NOTE

Trophies are awarded as per the Club's constitution. This document states a player must score 150 runs to win a batting trophy, and take 20 wickets to win a bowling trophy. The minimum number of games is 4 (8 in the one day competition). While the constitution says nothing about finals, runs and wickets are not included in awarding trophies. This is simply to maintain consistency, as fielding votes are not done in finals matches, and it would be greatly unfair for non-final participants when calculating points for the Ralph Dungey and Consistency trophies.

20/20 statistics have been kept totally separate, and as yet no trophies have been allocated for this separate competition. Wickets/runs from these matches have not been used for calculating points in the Ralph Dungey and Consistency trophies.

Finally, all statistics for 2008/09 in this Yearbook have been obtained from MyCricket, as at 31 March 2009. Any omissions/errors will hopefully be rectified when scorebooks have been received and the Club's statistics database has been updated.
