Editorial

Despite 1982/83 being devoid of such achievements as Premierships and Final Round appearances, there were aspects of the season that can be regarded with a reasonable degree of satisfaction. The "A" Grade side, although battling to avoid relegation in the concluding stages of the qualifying rounds, experienced their most successful season in 1st Grade since the 1976/77 season. When one considers that in our last 3 excursions into the top division we won only a total of 4 matches, it is apparent that our credibility to perform competitively in 1st Grade has been restored. Under the astute leadership of PETER QUARTERMAINE, the club overcame the age-old problem of inferior training facilities and began to reap some of the benefits of the re-building of the top side undertaken by ANDREW HAYWARD as coach in the previous two seasons.

The small turn-over of players from the previous season gave the sides greater stability this season. The loss of frontline players such as Dave Ewing, Noel Myers, Bob Firth, Kevin Berich and Haydn Gray was more than compensated for by the addition of prize "A" Grade recruits PAUL HUTTON, TOM DAWSON and GARY HARBORD, the return of the consistent CLIVE REYNOLDS, and the gaining of useful performers of the calibre of TED SMILEK, FRANK FARRELLY and the talented youngster IAN DICKERSON. Considering that the gains outbalanced the losses, it was, therefore, a disappointment to see the "B" Grade side perform so poorly. In fact, in the past 20 seasons there have only been two occasions ('63/64 & '72/73) when our number 2 side has won fewer games. In contrast, our number 3 side once again overcame the problem of lack of numbers (frequently calling on past players to fill in), and performed creditably despite missing out on the Final Four.

All-in-all, the club can face the challenge of next season with the knowledge that our top side has the ability to match most other 1st Grade sides but our success will depend upon two factors; our ability to retain those key players from this season and at the same time attract recruits of the quality we gained this season, together with the continued spirit shown over the past couple of seasons.

The best of luck over the winter break, and see you all next season.

"A" Grade

The "A" Grade's final analysis of 3 wins and 1 tie from 11 matches fails to really show how well the side performed. Their strength lay, primarily, with their bowling, led by pacemen PAUL HUTTON, TOM DAWSON, DAVE GITTUS and "ACE" HAYWARD supported by spinner BILL SKUTHORP. The batting, whilst evenly spread, lacked a consistent run getter other than captain-coach PETER QUARTERMAINE. As a result, the side was unable to set opponents really large targets. However, their fighting qualities in the field made them worthy opponents in 1st Grade. Wicketkeeper, STEVE MILLS, with 14 catches and 2 stumpings set the standard in the field with PAUL HUTTON, GARY HARBORD and TOM DAWSON not far behind in effectiveness.

"B" Grade

The "B" Grade had a disastrous start to their season and, despite 3 wins in a row late in the season, never really recovered and as a result earned demotion to 4th division in 1983/84. The batting proved to be extremely brittle with only CLIVE REYNOLDS and PHIL ROBERTS performing with credit, DAMIEN KNOWLES being the only other player to exceed 100 runs. The bowling was somewhat better. GEORGE WOODHEAD and TONY MALINS proved to be reliable and economical wicket-takers, receiving good support from a number of others. JOHN MCGURK, in only 3 appearances, showed outstanding all-round ability. The fielding, at times very mediocre, was highlighted by GREG DICKERSON who stood head and shoulders above his team-mates. CLAUDE QUINONES impressed with 5 catches and 3 stumpings in the last 3 qualifying games.

Although this was the only record set, there were a couple of "near misses" in the "B" Grade. JOHN MCGURK and DAMIEN KNOWLES failed by just 2 runs to better the 20 year-old record of 65 for the 5th wicket set by E. Treasure and E. Pumphrey, while CHRIS DILLON and GEORGE WOODHEAD were just 3 short of the best last wicket stand in "B" Grade (52 set by Peter & Mike Farrall in the 71/72 season).
