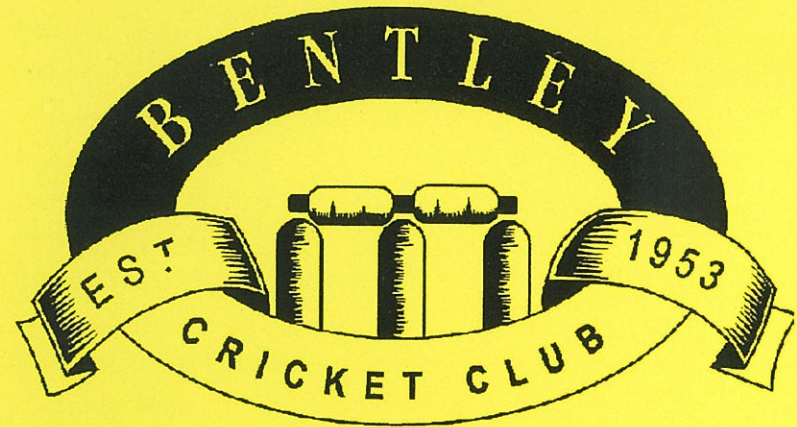

## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Report

The 2000/01 season saw Bentley's second team relegated back into 4<sup>th</sup> grade after spending the 99/00 season in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade. The previous three seasons had seen Bentley playing in the Grand Final, winning the 97/98 and 98/99 premierships. The 2000/01 season once again saw Bentley playing in the Grand Final.

The season got off to a great start in round 1 when Bentley defeated Hamersley/Carine. Bentley was set a target of 188. This game can best be remembered for the innings that Danny Accaro played. Danny hit a seasons high of 143 runs in his one and only game for the club this season. It was a fantastic innings that saw Bentley reach a total of 9/290.

This season has seen the 4<sup>th</sup> grade batting at the strongest it has ever been. In the 10 games of the qualifying rounds Bentley scored over 200 runs in an innings 8 times. Bentley won all 8 of these games. The old Suburban Turf belief that if you score 200 runs or more you will win the game was never more evident than in this season when Bentley had an 8/2 win/loss ratio. The losses came against Bedford/Morley and Doubleview. In the Bedford/Morley game, a one-day game just before Christmas Bentley made 9/96 from 40 overs and in the other loss against Doubleview just after Christmas, Bentley was all out for 181. Two scores under 200 for two losses.

The batting this season has been very balanced with seven 4<sup>th</sup> Grade players averaging over 30 runs during the qualifying rounds. The most damaging players with the bat this season have been Damien (Damage) Rickards with 461 runs at an average of 46.10 from 9 games and Matt Harmer with 381 runs at an average of 34.64. Both of these guys had fantastic years with the bat.

Damage's highest score for the season was a magnificent 107 in the Grand Final against South Perth and included 14 fours and 1 six. Damages batting this season in 4<sup>th</sup> Grade was tremendous, he also played three games in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade this season. Matt Harmer returned to form this season after a disappointing year last season, Matt had a highest score of 98 against Kalamunda. This was a chanceless innings from Matt and he was robbed of his first century by a dubious LBW decision.

The bowling this season can only be described as a team effort with six bowlers taking 12 wickets or more for the season. The surprise of the season (for everybody apart from the Captain) would have to have been the emergence of Matt Harmer as a strike bowler. Matt finished the season with 20 wickets, a fantastic effort for someone who until this season had rarely had the chance to bowl. Another very satisfying aspect of the bowling was the performance of Stephen (Dutchy) Henshall. Last season Dutchy spent most of the season in 7<sup>th</sup> grade bowling five or six overs per game, this season he has taken on the responsibility of opening the bowling down breeze in 4<sup>th</sup> Grade and done the job superbly.

Dutchy was also rewarded with a game in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade after a superb bowling effort taking 5/48 against Fremantle/Mosman Pk. Vice Captain Andrew (Beags) McLevie also had a best bowling this season of 5/48 against Kalamunda, these were the two outstanding bowling performances for the season.

Bentley finished the qualifying games in second place on the ladder and booked a semi-final appearance against Curtin / Vic. Pk who finished third. The Semi Final was played at Charles Verryard (east ) Reserve. Bentley lost the toss and was asked to bowl. The team started well and by tea Curtin/Vic Pk were 7/74. After tea Curtin/Vic Pk rallied and had moved to 8/188 by stumps. In the third over of play on Sunday C/VP were dismissed for 190. The best of the bowlers were Matt Harmer with 3/26 and Kirk Spencer with 2/32.

The run chase started well and most of the batsmen contributed to the score, Bentley won the game scoring 8/191 from 94.1 overs. Once again Matt Harmer was the star of the day making a patient 52, Damien Rickards scored 29, Justin Chandler 24 and Simon Magill 22. With this win the Bentley boys had booked their 4<sup>th</sup> Grand Final appearance in five years. Matt Harmer had a sensational game with both the bat and ball and was clearly the best player in the game.

In the Grand Final at Scott Reserve against South Perth (who finished the qualifying games in 4<sup>th</sup> spot) Captain Glenn Davies won the toss and decided to bat on an excellent batting track. At stumps on day one after 72 overs Bentley were six for 201 with Matt Harmer on 45 and Glenn Davies on 4. After 52 minutes of batting on day two Bentley were all out for 252. Damien Rickards top scored batting at three with 107, Damage's innings was sensational and should have set the team up for a huge score. When Damage finally succumbed to exhaustion Bentley were 4/160 from 49 overs. Matt Harmer was the second top scorer with 78. Matt played another patient innings and looked untroubled by the bowling. Matt lost his wicket in the 85<sup>th</sup> over trying to force the pace. Bentley never took advantage of the brilliant batting from Damage and Matt, the next highest score was 10.

South Perth lost an early wicket and were 1/6, the next wicket fell at 44 but from then on it was a huge struggle for the Bentley side. A third wicket stand of 119 sealed the game for South Perth, they went on to win the game in the 85<sup>th</sup> over with a score of 4/255. The Bentley bowlers toiled hard all day but struggled to get the results they deserved from the effort put in. The pitch became better to bat on as time passed.

In summary it was great season for the 4<sup>th</sup> grade side falling short of sensational by the lack of silverware in the trophy cabinet. Congratulations to all the players in 5<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grades on their premiership season.
